





Q5 Did you receive enough ballots from the Secretary of State?





Q7 Were you able to effectively use the Personal Protective Equipment, masks, gloves, hand sanitizer, etc. provided to improve safety at your polling place?





Q10 Approximately what percentage of voters used hand sanitizer at the polling place?



Q11 Were face masks or face coverings required in your Polling Place?



Q12 If your polling place required masks or face coverings, where was the alternative area for voters without a mask/face covering?



Q13 If your polling place required a mask or face covering, will you use the same alternative area for voters without a mask/face covering for the November 3 General Election?







Q17 At any time during election day did a persistent line form where previously registered voters had to wait 15 minutes or longer to get a ballot?





Q20 Did your polling place partially pre-process any absentee ballots?




