REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Environmental Services to award a Local Source Water Protection grant to the Rockingham Planning Commission (VC #154887 B001) in the amount of \$19,696 to complete a project to protect public drinking water systems, effective upon Governor and Council approval through May 31, 2019. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

The Department of Environmental Services issued a request for proposals for 2018 Local Source Water Protection Grants. These grants are funded by set-asides under the Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund. Twelve proposals were received. The proposals were evaluated and ranked based on criteria included in the request for proposals, such as whether the project fulfills a component of a source water protection program, that the proposed project addresses appropriate threats, and that the project will deliver a valuable and useful product. Based on the available federal funding and eligibility criteria, the Department determined that it could offer grants to seven source protection planning projects and three source security projects. See attachment A for the full list of grants awarded and list of reviewers.

Rockingham Planning Commission will use the grant funds to assess potential contaminant risks and offer source water protection options for communities within the region to consider for protecting local sources of drinking water. The work will produce community water supply resource maps, outreach materials and the Commission will hold educational workshops in the region.

This agreement has been approved as to form, substance, and execution by the Office of the Attorney General. In the event that federal funds no longer become available, General funds will not be requested to support this program. This grant award, while less than \$25,000 threshold, requires G&C approval as the Rockingham Planning Commission has already received funds in excess of the threshold for this fiscal year.





GRANT AGREEMENT

2. **SCOPE OF WORK.** In exchange for grant funds provided by the state of New Hampshire, acting through the agency identified in block 1.1 (hereinafter referred to as "the State"), pursuant to RSA 21-O, the Grantee identified in block 1.3 (hereinafter referred to as "the Grantee"), shall perform that work identified and more particularly described in the scope of work attached hereto as EXHIBIT A (the scope of work being referred to as "the Project").

3. **AREA COVERED.** Except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, the Grantee shall perform the Project in, and with respect to, the state of New Hampshire.

4. **EFFECTIVE DATE; COMPLETION OF PROJECT.**

4.1 This Agreement, and all obligations of the parties hereunder, shall become effective on the date in block 1.5 or on the date of approval of this Agreement by the Governor and Council of the State of New Hampshire whichever is later (hereinafter referred to as "the Effective Date").

4.2 Except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, the Project, including all reports required by this Agreement, shall be completed in ITS entirety prior to the date in block 1.6 (hereinafter referred to as "the Completion Date").

5. **GRANT AMOUNT; LIMITATION ON AMOUNT; VOUCHERS; PAYMENT.**

5.1 The Grant Amount is identified and more particularly described in EXHIBIT B, attached hereto.

5.2 The manner of, and schedule of payment shall be as set forth in EXHIBIT B.

5.3 In accordance with the provisions set forth in EXHIBIT B, and in consideration of the satisfactory performance of the Project, as determined by the State, and as limited by subparagraph 5.5 of these general provisions, the State shall pay the Grantee the Grant Amount. The State shall withhold from the amount otherwise payable to the Grantee under this subparagraph 5.3 those sums required, or permitted, to be withheld pursuant to N.H. RSA 80:7 through 7-c.

5.4 The payment by the State of the Grant amount shall be the only, and the complete, compensation to the Grantee for all expenses, of whatever nature, incurred by the Grantee in the performance hereof, and shall be the only, and the complete, compensation to the Grantee for the Project. The State shall have no liabilities to the Grantee other than the Grant Amount.

5.5 Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, and notwithstanding unexpected circumstances, in no event shall the total of all payments authorized, or actually made, hereunder exceed the Grant limitation set forth in block 1.8 of these general provisions.

6. **COMPLIANCE BY GRANTEE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS.**

In connection with the performance of the Project, the Grantee shall comply with all statutes, laws, regulations, and orders of federal, state, county, or municipal authorities which shall impose any obligations or duty upon the Grantee, including the acquisition of any and all necessary permits.

7. **RECORDS AND ACCOUNTS.**

7.1 Between the Effective Date and the date seven (7) years after the Completion Date the Grantee shall keep detailed accounts of all expenses incurred in connection with the Project, including, but not limited to, costs of administration, transportation, insurance, telephone calls, and clerical materials and services. Such accounts shall be supported by receipts, invoices, bills and other similar documents.

7.2 Between the Effective Date and the date seven (7) years after the Completion Date, at any time during the Grantee's normal business hours, and as often as the State shall demand, the Grantee shall make available to the State all records pertaining to matters covered by this Agreement. The Grantee shall permit the State to audit, examine, and reproduce such records, and to make audits of all contracts, invoices, materials, payrolls, records or personnel, data (as that term is hereinafter defined), and other information relating to all matters covered by this Agreement. As used in this paragraph, "Grantee" includes all persons, natural or fictional,

affiliated with, controlled by, or under common ownership with, the entity identified as the Grantee in block 1.3 of these general provisions.

8. **PERSONNEL.**

8.1 The Grantee shall, at its own expense, provide all personnel necessary to perform the Project. The Grantee warrants that all personnel engaged in the Project shall be qualified to perform such Project, and shall be properly licensed and authorized to perform such Project under all applicable laws.

8.2 The Grantee shall not hire, and it shall not permit any subcontractor, subgrantee, or other person, firm or corporation with whom it is engaged in a combined effort to perform such Project, to hire any person who has a contractual relationship with the State, or who is a State officer or employee, elected or appointed.

8.3 The Grant officer shall be the representative of the State hereunder. In the event of any dispute hereunder, the interpretation of this Agreement by the Grant Officer, and his/her decision on any dispute, shall be final.

9. **DATA; RETENTION OF DATA; ACCESS.**

9.1 As used in this Agreement, the word "data" shall mean all information and things developed or obtained during the performance of, or acquired or developed or obtained during the performance of, or acquired or developed by reason of, this Agreement, including, but not limited to, all studies, reports, files, formulae, surveys, maps, charts, sound recordings, video recordings, pictorial reproductions, drawings, analyses, graphic representations, computer programs, computer printouts, notes, letters, memoranda, papers, and documents, all whether finished or unfinished.

9.2 Between the Effective Date and the Completion Date the Grantee shall grant to the State, or any person designated by it, unrestricted access to all data for examination, duplication, publication, translation, sale, disposal, or for any other purpose whatsoever.

9.3 No data shall be subject to copyright in the United States or any other country by anyone other than the State.

9.4 On and after the Effective Date all data, and any property which has been received from the State or purchased with funds provided for that purpose under this Agreement, shall be the property of the State, and shall be returned to the State upon demand or upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, whichever shall first occur.

9.5 The State, and anyone it shall designate, shall have unrestricted authority to publish, disclose, distribute and otherwise use, in whole or in part, all data.

10. **CONDITIONAL NATURE OF AGREEMENT.**

Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, all obligations of the State hereunder, including without limitation, the continuance of payments hereunder, are contingent upon the availability or continued appropriation of funds, and in no event shall the State be liable for any payments hereunder in excess of such available or appropriated funds. In the event of a reduction or termination of those funds, the State shall have the right to withhold payment until such funds become available, if ever, and shall have the right to terminate this Agreement immediately upon giving the Grantee notice of such termination.

11. **EVENT OF DEFAULT; REMEDIES.**

11.1 Any one or more of the following acts or omissions of the Grantee shall constitute an event of default hereunder (hereinafter referred to as "Events of Default"):

11.1.1 failure to perform the Project satisfactorily or on schedule; or
11.1.2 failure to submit any report required hereunder; or
11.1.3 failure to maintain, or permit access to, the records required hereunder; or

11.1.4 failure to perform any of the other covenants and conditions of this Agreement.

11.2 Upon the occurrence of any Event of Default, the State may take any one, or more, or all, of the following actions:

11.2.1 give the Grantee a written notice specifying the Event of

Default and requiring it to be remedied within, in the absence of a greater or lesser specification of time, thirty (30) days from the date of the notice; and if the Event of Default is not timely remedied, terminate this Agreement, effective two (2) days after giving the Grantee notice of termination; and

11.2.2 give the Grantee a written notice specifying the Event of Default and suspending all payments to be made under this Agreement and ordering that the portion of the Grant Amount which would otherwise accrue to the grantee during the period from the date of such notice until such time as the State determines that the Grantee has cured the Event of Default shall never be paid to the Grantee; and

11.2.3 set off against any other obligation the State may owe to the Grantee any damages the State suffers by reason of any Event of Default; and

11.2.4 treat the agreement as breached and pursue any of its remedies at law or in equity, or both.

12. TERMINATION.

12.1 In the event of any early termination of this Agreement for any reason other than the completion of the Project, the Grantee shall deliver to the Grant Officer, not later than fifteen (15) days after the date of termination, a report (hereinafter referred to as the "Termination Report") describing in detail all Project Work performed, and the Grant Amount earned, to and including the date of termination.

12.2 In the event of Termination under paragraphs 10 or 12.4 of these general provisions, the approval of such a Termination Report by the State shall entitle the Grantee to receive that portion of the Grant amount earned to and including the date of termination.

12.3 In the event of Termination under paragraphs 10 or 12.4 of these general provisions, the approval of such a Termination Report by the State shall in no event relieve the Grantee from any and all liability for damages sustained or incurred by the State as a result of the Grantee's breach of its obligations hereunder.

12.4 Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, either the State or except where notice default has been given to the Grantee hereunder, the Grantee, may terminate this Agreement without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice.

13. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. No officer, member or employee of the Grantee and no representative, officer of employee of the State of New Hampshire or of the governing body of the locality or localities in which the Project is to be performed, who exercises any functions or responsibilities in the review or approval of the undertaking or carrying out of such Project, shall participate in any decision relating to this Agreement which affects his or her personal interests or the interest of any corporation, partnership, or association in which he or she is directly or indirectly interested, nor shall he or she have any personal or pecuniary interest, direct or indirect, in this Agreement or the proceeds thereof.

14. GRANTEE'S RELATION TO THE STATE. In the performance of this Agreement, the Grantee, its employees, and any subcontractor or subgrantee of the Grantee are in all respects independent contractors, and are neither agents nor employees of the State. Neither the Grantee nor any of its officers, employees, agents, members, subcontractors or subgrantees, shall have authority to bind the State nor are they entitled to any of the benefits, worker's compensation or emoluments provided by the State to its employees.

15. ASSIGNMENT AND SUBCONTRACTS. The Grantee shall not assign, or otherwise transfer any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the State. None of the Project Work shall be subcontracted or subgranted by the Grantee other than as set forth in Exhibit A without the prior written consent of the State.

16. INDEMNIFICATION. The Grantee shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the State, its officers and employees, from and against any and all losses suffered by the State, its officers and employees, and any and all claims, liabilities or penalties asserted against the State, its officers and employees, by or on behalf of any

person, on account of, based on, resulting from, arising out of (or which may be claimed to arise out of) the acts or omissions of the Grantee or Subcontractor, or subgrantee or other agent of the Grantee. Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing herein contained shall be deemed to constitute a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the State, which immunity is hereby reserved to the State. This covenant shall survive the termination of this agreement.

17. INSURANCE AND BOND.

17.1 The Grantee shall, at its sole expense, obtain and maintain in force, or shall require any subcontractor, subgrantee or assignee performing Project work to obtain and maintain in force, both for the benefit of the State, the following insurance:

17.1.1 statutory worker's compensation and employees liability insurance for all employees engaged in the performance of the Project, and

17.1.2 comprehensive public liability insurance against all claims of bodily injuries, death or property damage, in amounts not less than \$2,000,000 for bodily injury or death any one incident, and \$500,000 for property damage in any one incident; and

17.2 The policies described in subparagraph 17.1 of this paragraph shall be the standard form employed in the State of New Hampshire, issued by underwriters acceptable to the State, and authorized to do business in the State of New Hampshire. Each policy shall contain a clause prohibiting cancellation or modification of the policy earlier than ten (10) days after written notice has been received by the State.

18. WAIVER OF BREACH. No failure by the State to enforce any provisions hereof after any Event of Default shall be deemed a waiver of its rights with regard to that Event, or any subsequent Event. No express waiver of any Event of Default shall be deemed a waiver of any provisions hereof. No such failure or waiver shall be deemed a waiver of the right of the State to enforce each and all of the provisions hereof upon any further or other default on the part of the Grantee.

19. NOTICE. Any notice by a party hereto to the other party shall be deemed to have been duly delivered or given at the time of mailing by certified mail, postage prepaid, in a United States Post Office addressed to the parties at the addresses first above given.

20. AMENDMENT. This agreement may be amended, waived or discharged only by an instrument in writing signed by the parties hereto and only after approval of such amendment, waiver or discharge by the Governor and Council of the State of New Hampshire.

21. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT AND TERMS. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the law of the State of New Hampshire, and is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assignees. The captions and contents of the "subject" blank are used only as a matter of convenience, and are not to be considered a part of this Agreement or to be used in determining the intent of the parties hereto.

22. THIRD PARTIES. The parties hereto do not intend to benefit any third parties and this Agreement shall not be construed to confer any such benefit.

23. ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement, which may be executed in a number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties, and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings relating hereto.

EXHIBIT A
SCOPE OF WORK

Rockingham Planning Commission:

Rockingham Planning Commission (RPC) will use the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) grant funds to provide education, outreach and recommendations to municipal officials, businesses, and residents within its proscribed region (27 municipalities) about actions they can take for improving local source water protection. The project will evaluate threats within each community, review existing local protections to determine gaps and highlight voluntary source water protection options for each municipality. Specifically, the following tasks, as described in the application submitted to NHDES, will be accomplished:

Task 1: Audit of Local Source Protection. Develop an audit form that includes standard local source water protection measures listed in NHDES and/or US EPA, or other model source water protection guidance. Complete a review of existing land use regulations using the audit form for the 27 RPC communities. Obtain and incorporate NHDES criteria for initial and substantial implementation of protections for community public water systems when determining municipal protection scores. Establish a procedure for determining a quantitative baseline (minimum) source protection score calculated from the audit findings and evaluate each municipality from that baseline to determine the relative strength or weakness of source protection within each community. A draft of the audit form and score procedure(s) will be provided to NHDES for review and comment prior to completing the analysis.

Deliverable: Final Audit form, source protection database (MS Access or Excel format) that includes local protections within NHDES' Local Source Water Protection Ordinance Tracking Database, score procedure and municipal scores.

Task 2: Source Water Threat Assessment (GIS). Complete GIS threat assessments for active community public water systems within each municipality using a method and criteria similar to the NHDES Source Water Assessment Program susceptibility criteria. Updated threat assessments will be a factor in determining appropriate municipal protection measures consistent with NHDES guidance.

Task 3: Source Water Protection Mapping. Create a single regional drinking water source protection map and a series of municipal maps for the region showing detailed drinking water resources (aquifers, surface water), protection areas (land conservation), wellhead protection areas, water supply watersheds, zoning/code protected areas and gaps in local protection where source water protection areas (e.g., aquifers, WHPAs or water supply watersheds) extend outside municipal protection areas or into neighboring municipalities with no or lower protection.

Deliverable: Set of maps showing drinking water resource areas that highlight local protection and opportunities for increasing protection based on Task 1 audit findings for use in educational materials and workshops in Task 5 and 6. Provide draft maps for review by NHDES prior to finalizing the complete set of maps.

Task 4: Develop Outreach Materials. Create drinking water outreach materials consistent with existing materials from US EPA and NHDES regarding source water protection that recommend local policies and actions a municipality, business and/or resident can feasibly implement. Outreach materials will refer to local examples (case studies) of protection actions/strategies and findings from the municipal audit, threat assessments and maps developed in Task 1 through 3 (excluding security sensitive data). Final draft outreach materials will be provided to a community representative to review and obtain feedback from other local stakeholders. Those comments will be summarized for NHDES.

Deliverable: Final outreach materials for municipal officials, public water systems and businesses/residents reflecting local threat assessment and protection audit findings, mapping analysis and NHDES/community representative feedback. Outreach materials will be added to the RPC website.

Task 5: Local Engagement and Workshop Coordination. Coordinate and prepare three workshops within the RPC region that minimize travel time and maximize participation. RPC will take the primary lead in presenting at the workshops and prepare an advance list of invitees to include municipal planning staff, planning boards, conservation commissions, health officers, code enforcement officers, and selectman. At the project start, identify and request each community designate one or more local board members or interested individual(s) who will commit to act as a project liaison(s) to meet/review and discuss the project finding, regularly communicate with municipal officials about the project and assist with maximizing local workshop participation.

Task 6: Source Protection Workshops. Host three drinking water workshops in the RPC region. RPC intends to host three workshops in different areas of our region to provide a forum to learn about and discuss local issues surrounding source water protection. The workshops are intended to educate municipal officials, water system operators, business owners and residents about actions and policies that can be taken to better protect private and public water sources. The workshops will highlight project findings, present municipal-level gaps in source protection and offer a sign-up sheet for participants to follow up to establish efforts to improve municipal protection in their community. Workshops will request advance RSVPs and set a minimum of 15 participants in order to hold the event.

Deliverable: Three workshops that focus on the most common proactive steps municipalities, businesses and residents should take for improving source water protection. Materials and presentation will explain the methods for identifying gaps or weaknesses in local source protection and report generalized regional or municipal findings. The presentation will be posted on the RPC's website, attendee lists, attendees signing up to improve local protections and feedback will be forwarded to NHDES.

Task 7: Protection Recommendation Reports. Develop summary reports for each municipality with drinking water protection recommendations that increase protection based upon threat and local protection findings from Task 1-4 and associated municipal and NHDES feedback. The reports will contain a short narrative description of the threat assessment,

protections audit and maps from Task 3, as well as outreach materials, listings of possible funding sources.

Deliverable: Summary reports for each of RPC's 27 municipalities with prioritized source water protection actions that will better protect local drinking water resources.

Quarterly progress report forms must be completed by grant recipients or their subcontractor and submitted to NHDES every three months, beginning with the first full 3 month quarter after grant approval from Governor & Council.

EXHIBIT C
SPECIAL PROVISIONS

Work must be completed by the completion date listed on the grant agreement (section 1.6). Requests for payment along with required proof of work must be submitted no later than 90 days after the completion date or the grant will be closed out and funds will no longer be available.


