#### REQUESTED ACTION

- 1. Pursuant to RSA 9:16-c, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM), to transfers federal Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) funds, in the amount of \$21,000.00 in FY22 and \$221,000 in in FY23, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2023. Funding source: 100% Federal Funds.
- 2. Pursuant to RSA 124:15, and contingent upon the approval of requested action #1, authorize the Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, to create three temporary full-time positions: one Assistant Chief Emergency Management Specialist (LG23), one Program Planner I (LG 19), and one Program Assistant II (LG15), to assist with carrying out HSEM's mission. Effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council through June 30, 2023. Funding Source: 100% Federal Funds.

### **EXPLANATION**

The Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM) requests authorization to fund three new temporary full-time positions to support day-to-day operations and provide essential direction, coordination, guidance, and assistance, to ensure a comprehensive all-hazard emergency preparedness system exists at the State and local level. HSEM has experienced a significant increase in program area responsibilities that has identified the need for these positions that will ensure we are able to provide resources and federal funding opportunities to our stakeholders at the county and local level as well as with our private nonprofit partners. These positions will also create depth for HSEM's mission in the State Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to manage disasters and provide assistance to communities.

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The Assistant Chief Emergency Management Specialist will be working with the Division's Finance Administrator to ensure continuity of financial operations within the Business Section, by assisting with collecting, analyzing and compiling appropriation expenditures for annual, quarterly and monthly reports for the Division.

The Program Planner I will gather and analyze program information and provide graphic design support for the Division projects, by performing administrative and program support functions for the Community Outreach Office.

The Program Assistant II will be working to provide paraprofessional program and operational support for the school safety and preparedness program and for the NH School Safety Preparedness Task Force.

Development of the SFY22/23 budget occurred during the COVID-19 State of Emergency in which all HSEM resources were allocated to COVID-19 response activities. HSEM was unable to properly assess its organizational structure during the ongoing COVID-19 emergency response and was therefore unable to present these needs until now. HSEM intends on requesting that these temporary positions be converted to permanent positions during the Agency Phase of the SFY24/25 budget process.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG) provides state, local, tribal and territorial emergency management agencies with the resources required for implementation of the National Preparedness System and works toward the National Preparedness Goal of a secure and resilient nation. The EMPG's allowable costs support efforts to build and sustain core capabilities across the prevention, protection, mitigation, response and recovery mission areas.

The funds will be budgeted as follows:

- Class 020 Current Expenses: funding is available by cutting back so some planned purchases and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.
- Class 030 Equipment: funding is available by reducing planned expenditures and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.
- Class 037 Tech-Hardware: funding is available by reducing planned expenditures and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.
- Class 038 Tech- Software: funding is available by reducing planned expenditures and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.
- Class 039 Telecomm: funding is available by reducing planned expenditures and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.
- Class 046 Consultants: funding is available by reducing planned expenditures and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.
- Class 047 Own Forces Maint: funding is available by reducing planned expenditures and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.
- Class 048 Cont. Maintenance: funding is available by reducing planned expenditures and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.
- Class 059 Temp Full-Time: to be used to pay salaries for three new full-time temp positions supportin HSEM's operations.
- Class 060 Benefits: to pay the benefits associated with the program positions.

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- Class 070 In State Travel: funding is available by reducing planned expenditures and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.
- Class 102 Contracts for Op Services funding is available by reducing planned expenditures and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.
- Class 103 Contracts for Program Services funding is available by reducing planned expenditures and by utilizing other eligible federal funding sources.

The following information is provided in accordance with the comptroller's instructional memorandum dated September 21, 1981.

- 1) List of personnel involved: (1) Assistant Chief Emergency Management Specialist (LG23), (1) Program Planner I (LG 19), and (1) Program Assistant II (LG 15).
- 2) Nature, Need, and Duration: These positions are needed to assist HSEM with operations and administration. The proposed grant funding for this position ends on September 30, 2023.
- 3) Relationship to existing agency programs: These positions will provide support to HSEM operations and administration.
- 4) Has a similar program been requested of the legislature and denied? No.
- 5) Why wasn't funding included in the agency's budget request? These operational needs were not identified at the time the budget was created.
- 6) Can portions of the grant funds be utilized? All grant funds must be used for eligible work within the program area.
- 7) Estimate the funds required to continue this position: Funds for these positions are estimated at \$242,000.00 for the duration of the grant through June 30, 2023.

The funding mechanism is 100% Federal and there are no General funds required with this request.
