#### **Requested Action**

August 7, 2019

Authorize the Department of Safety (DOS), Division of Fire Safety to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with DOS Division of Fire Standards and Training and Emergency Medical Services (FSTEMS) in the amount of \$50,000.0% support the hazardous materials training program. Effective upon Governor and Council approval through September 30, 2020. Funding source: 100% Federal Funds.

Funding is anticipated to be available in the SFY 2020 operating budget as follows:

#### **Explanation**

The funds received under this grant will support the hazardous materials training to fire and EMS first responders throughout the State of New Hampshire and will cover instructional costs, equipment, and consumable purchases to allow for the continuation of the training. The course schedule meets the training responsibilities as outlined by OSHA, CFR 1910.120, and NFPA 472.

The MOU will be funded from the FFY'20 HMEP Grant Program, which was awarded to the Department of Safety, Division of Fire Safety by the US Department of Transportation (USDOT), Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) to support activities that increase State and local effectiveness in handling hazardous materials incidents, to enhance implementation of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA), and to encourage a comprehensive approach to emergency training and planning.

The Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) grant funds are 80% federally funded with a 20% match requirement supplied by the subrecipient (FSTEMS). FSTEMS acknowledges their match obligation as part of Section I of the MOU and will meet this cost share requirement of the grant by supplying course books and with the coordination of the training program.

In the event that Federal Funds are no longer available, General Funds and/or Highway Funds will not be requested to support this program.

### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) between the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management and the Division of Fire Standards and Training and EMS

Project Title: U.S. DOT Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) describes the U.S. Department of Transportation Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant activities that have been agreed to between the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management and the Division of Fire Standards and Training and EMS for the purpose of hazardous materials training for first responders.

This MOU is effective upon Governor and Council approval for costs incurred conducting grant activities through September 29, 2020.

For the purpose of the MOU, the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management and the Fire Standards and Training and EMS agree to cooperate as follows:

Section I: Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management agrees to the following:

- A. Provide Fire Standards and Training and EMS with \$50,000.00 on a reimbursement basis with a 20% soft match requirement in the amount of \$12,500.00 for the purpose of hazardous materials training for first responders.
- B. This MOU may be terminated for good cause by any one of the parties or for convenience if all parties agree, with the provision for orderly termination of the project. Termination of the MOU shall not occur until thirty (30) days after a "notice of termination" has been received by the other party. Said notice shall specify the cause for termination.

Section II: Division of Fire Standards and Training and EMS agrees to the following:

- A. Complete all activities specified in the activities outline of this MOU.
- B. Expend funds for this MOU solely for the work specified in the Activities Outline.
- C. Request reimbursement of expended funds from the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management, Attn: HMEP Grant Program Manager, in writing quarterly. Requests are to be submitted within thirty (30) days from the end of the quarter. Grant period ends September 29, 2020. Final billing must be received no later than October 30, 2020. Quarterly Reports are due upon this same schedule.

The NH Fire Academy will offer a Hazardous Materials Training Program under the Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness (HMEP) Grant Program covering awareness, operations, technician, incident command system, and decontamination training. Due to the nature of this training, classes will be scheduled in advance throughout the year to be reimbursed quarterly. However, because the fall programs have not been scheduled at this time, these trainings are still subject to change. Program expenses include instructor time, mileage, student manuals, and other materials needed for the delivery of the above programs.
