With everything going on, it's easy for us to forget that the ECS Policy Team has been regularly releasing new policy resources. Since May, ECS published three new 50-State Comparisons and five new policy reports, touching on issues across the preschool to workforce spectrum. You can take a quick look at all of them here. #### Commissioner Action Items:

 Appointed ECS Commissioners should save the date for our annual Winter Commissioners Meeting, set for November 29-December 2 at the Hotel del Coronado in sunny San Diego. We're really looking forward to seeing you all in person again, and we're already hard at work identifying the sessions that are going to be important to you all heading into 2023.

#### Convenings Updates:

A huge thank you to everyone who attended this month's Partnering for Success, Addressing Shortages Across the
Teacher Pipeline, with Arne Duncan; Jhone Ebert, Superintendent of Public Instruction, Nevada; and Katie Jenner,
Secretary of Education, Indiana. We had nearly 300 attendees from around the country! If you'd like to watch the
session, it's available here on ECS' NEW YouTube channel, so feel free to share with your teams as appropriate.

If you're interested in learning more about teacher issues, April's Partnering for Success, *Building a Strong Teacher Workforce Through Apprenticeships*, with Dr. Penny Schwinn, Commissioner of Education, Tennessee, is available to stream here.

Interstate Teacher Mobility Compact – ECS' partners at the Council of State Governments (CSG), the Department
of Defense (DoD) and the National Association of State Directors of Teacher Education and Certification (NASDTEC)
are working to support the mobility of licensed teachers through the development of a new interstate compact
that will create reciprocity among participant states and reduce the barriers to license portability and employment.
To learn more about the Interstate Teacher Mobility Compact, let your State Relations representative know and we
would be happy to connect you to the project leads. CSG is also gathering feedback on the <u>draft compact</u> via this
survey.

#### **Trending Topic: Dual Enrollment**

This fall, the ECS Policy Team is working on helping states tackle dual and concurrent enrollment issues. It's been a popular question these last few months, so we're eager to help state policymakers by providing inperson or virtual testimony or policy consultation on the topic, answering policy research questions, facilitating connections to other states doing the work, or facilitating discussions among your state leaders.

In the meantime, check out these dual and concurrent enrollment resources from our policy team:

- 50-State Comparison: Dual and Concurrent Enrollment Policies Data in this comprehensive resource, sorted by
  program within each state, includes policy found in statutes, regulations and other state policy documents and
  guidelines, as of May 2022, and is divided into five sections: program basics; access, including state policies on
  student occess to programs; courses, including state policies on course offerings and limitations; finance, including
  state policies on program finance; and quality, including state policies on quality assurance mechanisms associated
  with the program.
- <u>Prioritizing Equity in Dual Enrollment</u> This Palicy Brief defines dual enrollment and common borriers to entry for historically underserved student populations. It identifies three opportunities for policies to expand access and make it more equitable.


