EXPLANATION

The Department is requesting to accept and expend additional agency income from Provider Fees. These fees are derived from insurance companies payments for professional services provided to clients at the NH Community Residence program, also known as Philbrook Adult Transitional Housing (PATH). The Department seeks to utilize additional revenue not budgeted to address program expenses.

The original budget was based upon estimated revenues and expenses for a new program with no prior record of revenues and expenditures. The program commencement was expedited to assist with a reduction in the wait list for acute psychiatric services at NH Hospital. Funds from Provider Fees were not budgeted in fiscal year 2021 as the Department was unsure at what point in the year it would be able to bill for services.

The early opening of the facility impacted the operating expense projections, resulting in the need for additional appropriations to cover several more months of operating costs. The current job market has also presented challenges in hiring staff resulting in greater than anticipated need for overtime. The deterioration of the building infrastructure was greater than anticipated requiring additional appropriations for contractual maintenance of the building.
