RESIDENCY CHALLENGE OF ANNE C. GRASSIE – DEMOCRATIC
CANDIDATE FOR STATE REPRESENTATIVE FROM STRAFFORD DISTRICT
NO. 11—REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION

ORDER

On September 20, 2012, the Ballot Law Commission (“the Commission”) held a public hearing, pursuant to RSA 665:7 to hear and determine disputes arising over whether nomination papers or declarations of candidacy filed with the Secretary of State conform with the law. Specifically, the complainant, Rochester Representative Clifford A. Newton, challenged whether Rochester Representative Anne Grassie is currently residing in Rochester District No. 11, Ward 4. The Commission found that the candidate intended to reside in Ward 4 and allowed her to stay on the ballot.


On November 13, the Commission received a letter from a Steve Beaudoin, not the original petitioner, requesting reconsideration of the decision. As the letter does not set forth any basis for over-turning the decision, the request for reconsideration is denied.
