**Requested Action**

*Retroactive*

Authorize the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department to pay the Northeast Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (NEAFWA) Petersburg, NY 12138 (Vendor #156444), \$3,000.00 annual membership dues effective the date of Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2017. 100% Fish and Game Funds.

**Explanation**

The Northeast Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies (NEAFWA) was founded in 1946 as a quasi-governmental organization of public agencies charged with the protection and management of North America's fish and wildlife resources. NEAFWA's governmental members include all the fish and wildlife agencies of the 13 Northeast States and the District of Columbia.

NEAFWA is a key organization in promoting sound resource management and strengthening federal, state, and private cooperation in protecting and managing fish and wildlife and their habitats in the public interest. NEAFWA's role is to cultivate relations and mutual understanding among those officially engaged in the conservation of our natural resources and to especially coordinate the efforts of public administrative agencies responsible for the protection, preservation, and management of fish and wildlife resources of the Northeast Region. NEAFWA is a valuable resource in the efforts to promote fish and wildlife management and create and foster a healthy atmosphere in favor of better laws for the protection and management of natural resources.

This annual membership dues assessment is a fee established in NEAFWA bylaws by vote of the state agency directors.

*Since 1946, 71 years. NH Fish and Game was a founding member and the Director at the time, Ralph Carpenter II, was the first chairman.*

*The 13 northeast states and the District of Columbia. Fish and Game is the only state agency which is a member.*

*A fixed fee, the same for each member state, established in the bylaws by vote of the state agency directors.*





5. What benefit does the state receive from participating in this membership?  
*The organization, through its meetings and regional conservation needs program, fosters communication, exchange of ideas, and multi state efforts to deal with regional problems associated with habitat loss, endangered species, invasive species, climate change, and other issues that don't recognize political boundaries.*
6. Are training or educational/ research materials included in the membership? If so, is the cost included? Explain in detail.  
*Training, education, and research are typically funded through the regional conservation needs program using federal grants.*
7. Is the membership required to receive any federal grants or required in order to receive or participate in licensing or certification exams? Explain.  
*No*
8. Is there any travel included with this membership fee? Explain in detail any travel to include the number of employees involved, the number of trips, destination if known and purposes of membership supported trips.  
*The Executive Director typically travels twice a year to meetings in the northeast US. At the time of this writing that travel is being covered by a federal grant. At times staff may travel in support of technical committees. This may include the Wildlife Chief, Inland Fisheries Chief and the Non-Game Coordinator. In cases where members may be asked to travel to represent the Association in other organizations NEAFWA covers the costs of travel.*
9. Which state agency employees are directly involved with this organization? (Indicate if they are members, voting members, committee members, and/or officers of the organization.  
*The Executive Director is directly involved with this organization and is a voting member. Staff, as directed and approved by the Executive Director, may take on technical and supporting roles.*
10. Explain in detail any negative impact to the State if the Agency did not belong to this organization.  
*The opportunities for multistate coordinated efforts to attack various problems, as mentioned in #5, would be lost as well as the ability of New Hampshire to influence the Association in areas important to our state. Also, the two Association meetings are touch points attended by our regional federal partners in the US Fish and Wildlife Service, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration and the US Forest Service. We are far stronger as an association of 13 states pursuing a collective state perspective with the federal agencies than as individual states speaking alone.*
