### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources, Division of the Arts to award a Public Value Partnership Grant to Apple Hill Center for Chamber Music (VC #167103), Sullivan, NH in the amount of \$13,500 to strengthen their capacity for affordable diverse arts programs to New Hampshire residents and visitors effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2020. 100% General Funds

#### **EXPLANATION**

Public Value Partnerships are awarded to nonprofit arts organizations, with a minimum of five years of continuous arts programming and professional staffing, to strengthen their capacity for offering affordable, diverse arts program to New Hampshire's residents and visitors. Grant categories and deadlines are advertised through the divisions' website, social media and electronic newsletters.

At a recent meeting, the NH State Art Councilors unanimously voted to accept the Arts Division's Public Value Partnership Review Panel's recommendations for the partnerships based on its funding priority ranking within a competitive review. The six-member peer panel, facilitated by an Arts Councilor, considered seventeen criteria to arrive at a consensus ranking for each application. Each panelist is advised, both individually and collectively, of their obligation to disclose any conflict of interest and themselves from assessment if a conflict is present. The evaluative criteria range from the administrative capacity of the organization, artistic quality, strategic planning, to community impact and accessibility.

The Attorney General's office has approved the agreement as to form, substance and execution.

## NEW HAMPSHIRE STATE COUNCIL ON THE ARTS GRANT AGREEMENT

This agreement between the State of New Hampshire, New Hampshire State Council on the Arts (hereinafter "Council") and Apple Hill Center for Chamber Music (hereinafter "Grantee") is to witness receipt of funds subject to the following conditions:

## 1. GRANT PERIOD: FY2020

### 2. OBLIGATIONS OF THE GRANTEE:

- The Grantee agrees to accept \$13,500.00 and apply it to the program(s) described in the grant application and approved budget for Investment in Cultural Infrastructure. In the performance of this grant agreement, the Grantee is in all respects an independent contractor and is neither an agent nor employee of the State.
- Funding credit including Council logo must appear in all programs, publicity, and promotional materials. The following wording and Council logo should be used:

- The Grantee acknowledges that the NHSCA Program Coordinator may schedule a site visit to the organization and may request a site visit from the NHSCA.
- The Grantee agrees to abide by the limitations, conditions and procedure outlined herein and in the attached
  appendices. If appropriated funds for this grants program are reduced or terminated, all payments under this grant
  may cease. That determination rests within the sole discretion of the Council.
- 3. PAYMENT will be made following the receipt and execution of all required documents and approval of the Governor and Executive Council.
- 4. FINAL REPORT: The Grantee agrees to submit a final financial and narrative report on a form provided by the Council no more than 30 days after the end of the grant period. Failure to submit the final report will render the Grantee ineligible for Council funding for two years.
- SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY: No provision of this contract is to be deemed a waiver of sovereign immunity by the State
  of New Hampshire.

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



With a career in the performing arts spanning over 30 years, Leonard Matczynski has worked as a concert violist, teacher, and arts administrator. As the Director of Apple Hill, he makes decisions that shape Apple Hill's performance and administrative structure, its concert and touring programs, the *Playing for Peace* initiative, its long-range plans, and the development of new programs. He is the spokesman for Apple Hill's mission and its representative to the music community, patrons, and audiences.

As a concert violist, he studied with Martha Strongin Katz, Heidi Castleman, and Karen Tuttle, participated in chamber music studies with members of the Budapest, Cleveland, and Guarneri Quartets, and pursued advanced studies at the *International Musician's Seminar* in Prussia Cove, England with Sandor Vegh. In addition to his teaching activities with Apple Hill, he has been on the faculty of Walnut Hill School for the Arts, New England Conservatory of Music, Boston Conservatory at Berklee, and the Tanglewood Music Center.

From 1993-2007, he was the founding executive director of Boston's Emmanuel Music, responsible for the organization's development through performances of Bach Cantatas; the complete chamber, vocal, and piano works of Debussy, Brahms, Schubert, Schumann, Stravinsky, and John Harbison; operas by Handel, Mozart, and Schubert; as well as innovative collaborations and tours with stage director Peter Sellars, choreographer Mark Morris, and mezzo-soprano Lorraine Hunt Lieberson.

Outside of Apple Hill, he was one of the founders and past chairs of Arts Alive, an organization that promotes arts and culture in the Monadnock region of NH, and was chosen to participate in the 2016 Leadership NH program, a program that increases civic involvement in communities by educating and connecting leaders from throughout the state of NH.

In Summer 2019, 300 students and 45 faculty hailed from 31 U.S. states and 12 countries: Mexico, Canada, Cyprus, Indonesia, Ireland, Israel, Egypt, Lebanon, Jordan, Peru, Syria, Turkey, and USA. A "typical" Apple Hill ensemble might include a high school senior cellist from Keene, New Hampshire, a high school freshman violinist from Dallas, Texas, a viola teacher from Istanbul, Turkey, a college-age guitarist from Lima, Peru, and a retired math professor double bassist from New York City. 23 students were from New Hampshire, ten of whom received financial aid or work study subsidies totaling \$19,000. Apple Hill presents a public Summer faculty concert series of ten recitals in its 110-seat concert barn (plus additional free, unlimited seating on the lawn). Nearly 80% of our ticket buyers come from 30 New Hampshire municipalities, with the highest concentrations from 13 towns within Cheshire County.
