EXPLANATION

The Department is requesting that this membership be approved **retroactive** to July 1, 2014 due to the fact that the invoice was not received until after the fiscal year had begun.

The Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO) has a State Consortium on Educator Effectiveness (SCEE) to address issues of educator effectiveness. CCSSO designed the Consortium with active input from chiefs, deputies, and state agency staff dedicated to teacher and school leader policy.

1. How long has this organization been in existence and how long has this agency been a member of this organization?

The Council of Chief State School Officers (CCSSO) has recently formed (three years) State Consortium on Educator Effectiveness (SCEE) to address issues of educator effectiveness. The Department Of Education has been a member for three (3) years.

2. Is there any other organization which provides the same or similar benefits which your agency belongs to?

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No. Since this service is only available through CCSSO.

3. How many other states belong to this organization and is your agency the sole New Hampshire state agency that is a member?

Representatives from Twenty-six states have voiced their interests and needs in three different design meetings. The New Hampshire Department of Education is the sole state agency eligible for membership.

New Hampshire has the opportunity to collaborate on this coordinated work as it shapes the policies and practices that serve to improve the effectiveness of our educators. Within CCSSO's broader strategy for systemic transformation, the State Consortium on Educator Effectiveness addresses a limited number of priority actions that help New Hampshire increase the effectiveness of teaching and leading in order to improve student achievement and eliminate disparities.

The Consortium works to build New Hampshire's capacity within the priority topics described above and articulate and address key state level needs in those areas. Specific deliverables include:

 - a) Model state policy frameworks, guidelines, roadmaps, and legislative language
 - b) Case studies of state actions
 - c) Policy briefs focused on state interests
 - d) Web-based platforms for information sharing, including video images of exemplary practices linked to the student, teaching, and leading standards


