CSG's Policy Academy Series delivers timely policy programming directly to members in their states or at a condensed national/regional level, undertaking new and unique informational and leadership training sessions and convening issue-specific gatherings that impacts states.

Each Policy Academy Series event, while tailored to specific policy areas, seeks to accomplish the following outcomes:

- **Informed Policymaking** – participants are better able to serve in their elected positions if they have a higher level of knowledge concerning key policy issues;
- **Critical Analysis** – participants are able to examine policy issues in a more critical manner. Participants progress from the levels of knowledge and comprehension to more advanced levels of application, analysis, synthesis and evaluation;
- **Colleague Education** – participants are able to share information learned at the academies with fellow legislators, thus expanding the knowledge base of a wider policymaking audience;
- **Effect Change** – participants are better positioned to influence policy outcomes in their states and at the federal level as result of the specific policy curriculum and focus of the academy events; and
- **Prepare Leaders** – participants are better positioned, as a result of the knowledge gained, to assume leadership positions in key policy areas.

Policy Academy Series events include plenary and interactive dialogue sessions convened in a training environment. Where possible, experiential learning opportunities are developed as are opportunities to engage policymakers at the federal level. Policy Academy Series meetings are typically scheduled for three days and target approximately 25 state leaders – overwhelmingly legislators. Attendee costs are usually covered by the program.
