REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of the Commissioner, to enter into a **Sole Source** amendment to an existing contract with Deloitte Consulting, LLP (VC#174776), Concord, NH to complete additional enhanced data analytics for Opioid crisis response, pre-school development analytics and analysis impacting future community collaborations supporting children in New Hampshire, by increasing the price limitation by \$1,370,202 from \$8,069,948 to \$9,440,150 and by extending the contract completion date from November 29, 2021, to June 30, 2022, effective upon Governor and Council approval. 100% Other Funds.

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on May 1, 2019 (Item #18). It was amended with Governor and Council approval on December 18, 2019 (Item #14); amended with Governor approval on July 20, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020 (Informational Item #A); amended with Governor approval on October 5, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on November 18, 2020 (Informational Item #L); amended with Governor approval on October 28, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on January 22, 2021 (Informational Item #A), amended with Governor approval on April 1, 2021, and presented to the Executive Council on May 19, 2021 (Informational Item #C), and amended with Governor and Executive Council approval on September 15, 2021 (Item #16D-1).

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2022, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.

EXPLANATION

This amendment is **Sole Source** because the Department is requesting to extend the contract beyond the completion date and there are no renewal options available. The Department is seeking to extend the existing contract with Deloitte Consulting, LLP because the Contractor is uniquely positioned to immediately support the Department's efforts to integrate disparate data sets and improve data analytics, overall data quality, visualization, and reporting with existing data sources to support three (3) critical State initiatives that are designed to improve outcomes for vulnerable young children, decrease opioid misuse and support opioid treatment, and reduce the number of children entering foster care.

The Department will be competitively bidding the services provided under this contract in Calendar Year 2022 as an appropriation was made through the capital budget (House Bill 25 of

response to the COVID-19 pandemic to address its effects on the opioid crisis and was originally competitively bid in the fall of 2018 (6 responses were received) and awarded in May 2019. When the contract was originally awarded, the Department could not foresee the COVID-19 pandemic and anticipate its negative exacerbating effects on the opioid crisis, vulnerable children, and the foster care system. Consequently, the needs for enhanced data functionality have increased rapidly through the COVID-19 pandemic.

The purpose of this amendment is to integrate new data sources and improve data analytics, overall data quality, visualization, and reporting with existing data sources to support three (3) efforts:

- Pre-school Development Grant Birth through age 8: This initiative seeks to better understand the current early childhood system and use the integrated data to strengthen the system, better address the needs of vulnerable young children and their families, and help build a solid foundation to improve outcomes for NH's children, families, schools, and communities. The Department, in collaboration with University of New Hampshire and Department of Education applied for and received an award for a grant to support a "data driven policy and program coordination team to work towards the vision of New Hampshire's families and young children having access to quality resources and supports within their communities to learn, grow and thrive." The Department is also collaborating with the Governor's early childhood council (NH Council for Thriving Children), and New Hampshire's early childhood advocates and practitioners on this initiative.
- Opioid Data to Action OD2A: Focuses on understanding and tracking the complex and changing nature of the drug overdose epidemic. Further, this effort highlights the need for the seamless integration of data into prevention strategies and enhancements to the State's Enterprise Business Intelligence (EBI) platform. Data integration and enhanced reporting will allow the Department to better address the goals of the OD2A program surrounding the opioid crisis. These enhancements will present new insights regarding the impact of opioids in New Hampshire and will allow the Department to monitor the effectiveness of State-led programs to decrease opioid misuse and support opioid treatment and recovery efforts.
- Community Collaborations to Strengthen and Preserve Families (CCSPF): This initiative is a grant in partnership with UNH goaled to establish an integrated continuum of family support, with community-based services such as mental health and substance misuse treatment, economic supports, home visiting, and educational programs, to prevent child abuse and neglect to ultimately reduce the number of children entering foster care. This effort is supported by funding provided by the United States Administration for Children and Families. The enhancements included in this amendment will support the strengthening of families through Community Collaborations to partner with UNH to analyze the de-identified data to address potential outcomes such as reduced child welfare referrals, reduced founded cases of child maltreatment and/or neglect, reduced out of home placement, and increased utilization of services designed to improve protective factors in families

The Department determined a sole source extension of the existing contract would be the most cost-effective and beneficial to support the aforementioned initiatives for the following reasons:

 Reduced time to delivery of data ingestion, data modeling and data visualization based on the teams integrated knowledge of the State of New Hampshire business processes, enterprise architecture and data integrations; His Excellency, Governor Christopher T. Sununu Page 3 of 5

- Reduced costs because the State leveraged the competitively bid rates included in Table 1.4 of the original contract (May 2019 G&C Agenda, Item #18, PDF page 54), and locked in at the rates negotiated in May 2019 – avoiding year-over-year increases per the original terms.
- Minimal startup costs as the data team is already working on existing projects and familiar with the data in question;
- Ability to achieve data driven results in a shorter period of time eliminating a competitive bidding process, which could delay the projects by at least six (6) months or longer depending on knowledge transfer and training needs for a new contractor;
- · Potential federal funding may be forfeited depending on length of delays; and
- Opportunity costs associated with not moving forward with a sole source are that more children will suffer maltreatment or neglect, additional home placement will be necessary and services will be increased due to lack of visibility to gaps that could have been addressed if the data was available sooner in the process as well as the reduced access for children to learn, grow and thrive as a result of not have access to the information associated with these federally funded activities to utilize data to drive changes in programs and services to improve outcomes.

The Contractor will provide the State with the necessary resources to bring solutions to integrate data from more than 25 program sources to establish an Early Childhood Integrated Data System (ECIDS) to collect, maintain, store and report information from early childhood programs across multiple agencies that serve families with children. Attachment #1 of this letter details the 18 different professional services areas that will be paid for through this amendment.

This data integration, data analytics, reporting, visualization work and continued expansion of the COVID-19 Response Management Business Intelligence components will allow for data driven decision-making assistance. As the utilization of the system has grown exponentially over the last two (2) years, and the ability to scale the architecture of the system has been implemented, the Department is positioned to further capitalize on the reporting accuracy and efficiency of the system.

Professional Services

Overview: Deloitte Consulting, LLP will provide the following professional services to assist in the 18 areas:

- Integrate eligibility information of non-medical assistance programs administered within the NewHEIGHTS system, and NewHEIGHTS COVID Testing medical assistance eligibility, into the State of New Hampshire Enterprise Business Intelligence (EBI) Platform: assistance programs to include cash assistance, food assistance, emergency assistance, and child care assistance.

Summary of Need

New Hampshire's Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and Department of Education (DOE) share in their mission to provide impactful supportive services across the state that improve outcomes for New Hampshire's youth, families, schools, and communities. Together, DHHS and DOE administer numerous programs that provide additional child development services for families of children with special needs, children at risk, or experiencing financial hardships.

New Hampshire is following a strategic plan to establish an early childhood integrated data system (ECIDS) to collect, integrate, maintain, store, and report information from early childhood programs across multiple agencies that serve families with children. The broad purpose of an ECIDS is to provide integrated, cross-program data that inform decisions about early childhood policies, services, and education.

The work activities described within this scope of services enables the State-owned EBI platform to become the central data repository to support analytics, dashboards, and reporting on early childhood programs. Through this amendment, the State seeks to integrate early childhood data from DHHS and DOE into the EBI environment to be able to answer questions about early childhood programs and participation across New Hampshire.

Examples of questions the State intends to answer and monitor from this initiative with dashboards include the following:

How many children are served ages 0-8 in public programs across the state?

- Goal: To know the number (and percent if denominator can be established) of children served:
 - As a whole
 - o Count & population rate breakdowns by:
 - Age
 - Race or other demographic info
 - Geographic region (county, town, zip depending on availability)
 - Other child or family characteristics (ex: income/poverty, homelessness, health characteristics or social determinants of health, depending on what is available)
 - o Geographic mapping based on data availability

Concurrent and Subsequent Services and Enrollments

What combinations of services do children and families receive in a given time frame? What combinations of services do children and families receive as the child ages?

Goal: To know what services children and families most commonly receive at the same time, and to

know what common service paths children and families follow in order to provide coordinated care and transition services.

- Example data elements:
 - O Child identifying info name, DOB, other information (e.g., address, family info) as available: Note, identifying info shall only be used to establish links across programs, and find and merge duplicates. Identifiers would be secure and not accessible to anyone outside of designated staff. Person matching is a reliable, automated process. Any data that is brought into EBI follows the same security and governance policies as the original data source. Child attributes (i.e., race/ethnicity)
 - o County ID/Zip Code (or other geographic identifier)
 - o Program ID
 - o Program Name
 - Participation (length of time in program)
 - Timeframe (years/date range included)

Scope of Work

The Contractor agrees to provide additional services and data totaling \$339,526 as set forth in Table 1.12, SFY 2022 Overdose Data to Action. For these services, the Contractor shall provide the identified staffing to support State-directed work. With Contractor PMO concurrence, the State will authorize Contractor activities for these Services on a weekly basis. These activities will be prioritized via Jira and Vendor will produce bi-weekly status reports, including hours incurred with resource burn down. The Contractor will invoice for actual hours incurred on a monthly basis, not to exceed \$339,526 without an approved change order for the services as set forth in Table 1.12, SFY 2022 Overdose Data to Action.

Specific Work Activities Provided by the Vendor shall include:

- Assisting DHHS with creating stimulants and poly drug use events codes with AHEDD ED visit data and incorporating into the Opioid Crisis dashboard.
- Implementing ETL process for monthly State Unintentional Drug Overdose Reporting System (SUDORS)
 data file.
- Further enhancing the EBI data model to better support analytics on members receiving assessments (GPRA) through the NH Doorway programs.
- Ingesting additional tables/views as needed from the WITS recurring database extract to improve reporting on patient residence and incorporate into opioid dashboards.
- Incorporating additional visualizations of the impact of poly drug use/stimulants into the existing
 Opioid Crisis dashboards (e.g., ED use, deaths)
- Developing download tables of each visualization in the existing Opioid Crisis dashboards
- Making corrections, as needed, in Opioid Crisis dashboards and dashboards data sources to improve quality of the data presented
- Assisting DHHS with building internal dashboards to help monitor and evaluate the NH Doorway programs.
- Developing a replacement dashboard for current public static reporting on NH Doorway metrics (https://www.thedoorway.nh.gov/node/8156)
- Building an internal dashboard to allow staff to easily see trends and patterns in SUDORS data.

Summary of Need

Overdose Data to Action (OD2A) supports jurisdictions in collecting high quality, comprehensive, and timely data on nonfatal and fatal overdoses and in using those data to inform prevention and response efforts. OD2A focuses on understanding and tracking the complex and changing nature of the drug overdose epidemic and highlights the need for seamless integration of data into prevention strategies. These enhancements to the State's EBI platform implement the goals of the OD2A program with additional data integration, reporting, and automation services to present new insights regarding the impact of opioids in New Hampshire and monitor the effectiveness of State-led programs to decrease opioid misuse and support opioid treatment and recovery efforts.

Scope of Work

The Contractor agrees to provide additional services and data totaling \$93,051 as set forth in Table 1.13 SFY 2022 Community Collaborations to Strengthen and Preserve Families. For these services, the Contractor shall provide the identified staffing to support State-directed work. With Contractor PMO concurrence, the State shall authorize Contractor activities for Services on a weekly basis. Activities shall be prioritized via Jira and Contractor shall produce bi-weekly status reports, including hours incurred with resource burn down. The Contractor shall invoice for actual hours incurred on a monthly basis, not to exceed \$93,051 without an approved change order for the services as set forth in Table 1.13 SFY 2022 Community Collaborations to Strengthen and Preserve Families.

Specific Work Activities Provided by the Contractor shall Include:

- Collaborating with DHHS to determine how to extend the State's Enterprise Business Intelligence
 (EBI) Platform to integrate data from the Family Strengthening Data System (FSDS) (a QuickBase
 solution) used by the Family Resource Centers (FRCs) to assess local family needs, develop service
 plans, make service referrals, and capture family encounters.
- Developing and operationalizing data integration procedures to retrieve data from the FSDS through available APIs and load data to the EBI Platform.
- Integrating data from the Protective Factor Survey Online Database System with family data received from the FSDS.
- Developing an ongoing process to continue to receive new survey responses available in the Protective Factor Survey Online Database System.
- Enhancing the EBI reporting model with information received from the FSDS.

Summary of Need

Within the Bureau of Population Health and Community Services, the Community Collaborations to Strengthen and Preserve Families (CCSPF), program establishes an integrated continuum of family support, with community-based services such as mental health and substance misuse treatment, economic supports, home visiting, and educational programs, to prevent child abuse and neglect and ultimately reduce the number of children entering foster care.

The CCSPF program goals are to:

- Reduce children entering foster care, and reduce intake and referrals to child welfare;
- Increase collaboration across service systems to move towards integration and collective planning; and





REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Office of the Commissioner, to enter into a Retroactive amendment to an existing contract with Deloitte Consulting LLP (VC#174776), Concord, NH to complete additional enhanced data analytics for school dashboard, hospital bed tracking, and vaccine administration associated with the COVID-19 response, by increasing the price limitation by \$836,550 from \$7,233,398 to \$8,069,948 with no change to the contract completion date of November 29, 2021, effective retroactive to August 16, 2021 upon Governor and Council approval. 100% Other Funds.

The original contract was approved by Governor and Council on May 1, 2019 (Item #18). It was amended with Governor and Council approval on December 18, 2019 (Item #14); amended with Governor approval on July 20, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on August 26, 2020 (Informational Item #A); amended with Governor approval on October 5, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on November 18, 2020 (Informational Item #L); amended with Governor approval on October 28, 2020, and presented to the Executive Council on January 22, 2021 (Informational Item #A), and amended with Governor approval on April 1, 2021, and presented to the Executive Council on May 19, 2021 (Informational Item #C).

Funds are available in the following accounts for State Fiscal Year 2022, with the authority to adjust budget line items within the price limitation and encumbrances between state fiscal years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified.



EXPLANATION

The request is retroactive because the Department did not have the fully executed contract documents in time for Governor and Executive Council approval to prevent the current contract from expiring. On November 4, 2019 the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), notified the Department of an extension opportunity from the original deadline of November 29, 2020 to expond the funds to March 29, 2020. Oue to the compressed timelrame we were unable to meet the deadline for the November meeting.

Additionally, the Department plans to leverage the Opioid Data To Action Grant funding to create an innovative surveillance strategy by integrating the TEMSIS (Trauma Emergency Medical Services Information System) data source for emergency management services with the Enterprise Business Intelligence platform that contains Medicaid and commercial claims, Behavioral Health Substance and Opioid Use

Disorder data, Child Welfare and Automated Hospital Emergency Department Data (AHEDD) to allow for real-time awareness of overdoses as they relate to the treatment services.

The original agreement, included language in Part 2, Information Technology Provisions, Section 2, Contract Terms, Paragraph 2, that allows the Department to renew the contract for up to one (1) year, subject to the continued availability of funding, satisfactory performance of service, parties written authorization and approval from the Governor and Executive Council. The Department and Contractor are in agreement with renewing services for the remaining one (1) year at this time.

Should the Governor and Executive Council not authorize this request, the Department will miss the unique opportunity to enhance the data and analytic systems that support current needs relative to the opioid crisis, as well as impact future capabilities of the Department's data systems in order to provide holistic analysis of emerging issues, programs, populations and business functions.
