REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources, Division of the Arts to award a Public Value Partnership Grant to Peterborough Players, Inc. (VC #154380), Peterborough, NH in the amount of \$13,500 to strengthen their capacity for affordable diverse arts programs to New Hampshire residents and visitors effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2020. 100% General Funds

Funding is available in account, State Arts Development, as follows:

EXPLANATION

Public Value Partnerships are awarded to nonprofit arts organizations, with a minimum of five years of continuous arts programming and professional staffing, to strengthen their capacity for offering affordable, diverse arts program to New Hampshire's residents and visitors. Grant categories and deadlines are advertised through the divisions' website, social media and electronic newsletters.

At a recent meeting, the NH State Art Councilors unanimously voted to accept the Arts Division's Public Value Partnership Review Panel's recommendations for the partnerships based on its funding priority ranking within a competitive review. The six-member peer panel, facilitated by an Arts Councilor, considered seventeen criteria to arrive at a consensus ranking for each application. Each panelist is advised, both individually and collectively, of their obligation to disclose any conflict of interest and themselves from assessment if a conflict is present. The evaluative criteria range from the administrative capacity of the organization, artistic quality, strategic planning, to community impact and accessibility.

The Attorney General's office has approved the agreement as to form, substance and execution.

NEW HAMPSHIRE STATE COUNCIL ON THE ARTS GRANT AGREEMENT

This agreement between the State of New Hampshire, New Hampshire State Council on the Arts (hereinafter "Council") and Peterborough Players Inc. (hereinafter "Grantee") is to witness receipt of funds subject to the following conditions:

1. GRANT PERIOD: FY2020

2. OBLIGATIONS OF THE GRANTEE:

- The Grantee agrees to accept \$13,500:00 and apply it to the program(s) described in the grant application and approved budget for Investment in Cultural Infrastructure. In the performance of this grant agreement, the Grantee is in all respects an independent contractor and is neither an agent nor employee of the State.
- Funding credit including Council logo must appear in all programs, publicity, and promotional materials. The following wording and Council logo should be used:



Peterborough Players Inc. is supported in part by a grant from the New Hampshire State Council on the Arts & the National Endowment for the Arts.

New Hampshire State Council on the Arts

- The Grantee acknowledges that the NHSCA Program Coordinator may schedule a site visit to the organization and may request a site visit from the NHSCA.
- The Grantee agrees to abide by the limitations, conditions and procedure outlined herein and in the attached appendices. If appropriated funds for this grants program are reduced or terminated, all payments under this grant may cease. That determination rests within the sole discretion of the Council.
- 3. PAYMENT will be made following the receipt and execution of all required documents and approval of the Governor and Executive Council.
- 4. FINAL REPORT: The Grantee agrees to submit a final financial and narrative report on a form provided by the Council no more than 30 days after the end of the grant period. Failure to submit the final report will render the Grantee ineligible for Council funding for two years.
- 5. **SOVEREIGN IMMUNITY**: No provision of this contract is to be deemed a waiver of sovereign immunity by the State of New Hampshire.

15% of our audience comes from Peterborough, 39% from the other 39 towns in the Monadnock Region (Alstead, Antrim, Bennington, Chesterfield, Deering, Dublin, Fitzwilliam, Francestown, Gilsum, Greenfield, Greenville, Hancock, Harrisville, Hillsborough, Hinsdale, Jaffrey, Keene, Lyndeborough, Marlborough, Marlow, Mason, Milford, Nelson, New Ipswich, Richmond, Rindge, Roxbury, Sharon, Stoddard, Sullivan, Surry, Swanzey, Temple, Troy, Walpole, Westmoreland, Wilton, Winchester, and Windsor), and 18% from throughout the rest of New Hampshire -- another 28% comes from outside the state.
