REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a. VI, authorize the Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) to accept and expend \$283,500 in federal funds from the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) to provide support for the Land Resource Management Program, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor & Council approval through June 30, 2023. Funding is 100% Federal Funds. This is an allowable use of ARP FRF funds under Section 602 (c)(1)(D) to respond to the public health emergency or its negative economic impacts.

NHDES is requesting transfer of funding as follows:

EXPLANATION

The American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021, is a \$1.9 trillion economic stimulus bill passed by the 117th United States Congress and signed into law by President Biden on March 11, 2021, to speed up the United States' recovery from the economic and health effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and the resultant recession. The Act defines eligible uses of the state and local funding, including responding to public health emergency, responding to workers performing essential work during the COVID -19 emergency, providing revenue relief to states and making investments in water, sewer and broadband infrastructure.

The NHDES Land Resources Management Program is responsible for issuing permits for development projects. ARPA funding for infrastructure projects will increase demand for permits, many of which will need to be processed on an expedited timeline to meet federal deadlines. Additional staffing is needed to handle this surge of permits without delays. The strategy will be to speed up permitting decisions for drinking water and wastewater infrastructure projects through outreach and training of consultants and state employees to improve both the quality of applications submitted and the speed of reviews. resulting improvement in processing times will smooth the way for the surge of infrastructure projects as well as needed development throughout the state.

To cover the program share of statewide indirect costs.

NHDES is requesting to budget these additional funds as shown below:

The additional amount of \$157,210 will not be used for new positions. These funds are available in support of an expanded program beyond the original budget scope. Employee support from other DES organizational units will be utilized to administer this program. These funds will be used to replace funding of the following full time positions. FAQ 48 from US Treasury states that payroll and benefits of employees managing new grant programs established with FRF is an allowable use.
