REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, the Department of Natural and Cultural Resources, Division of Parks and Recreation, Bureau of Trails, requests authorization to accept and expend Federal Lands Access Program funds in the amount of \$102,800 from the Federal Highway Administration for the purpose of repairing roads and access routes within or to federal lands upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council approval through June 30, 2021. 100% Federal Funds.

Funds are to be budgeted in Fiscal Years 2020 and 2021 in the following account:

EXPLANATION

The Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP) is a Federal Highway Administration program which is used for the repair of roads and access routes within or to Federal Lands. The Pondicherry Wildlife Refuge, located in Jefferson, is primarily accessed by way of the Presidential Recreational Rail Trail. The Rail Trail is owned by the State of New Hampshire and is a year-round multi-use recreational trail. The intent of the FLAP grant is to improve the trail surface, to make it more accommodating to all levels of trail users, and to comply with accessibility guidelines for individuals with physical limitations. The grant is a cooperative project with the US Fish and Wildlife Service. They will be responsible for providing a 20% match for the grant. The funds will be used to improve the trail surface with an aggregate material, such as stone dust, and will also be used to improve drainage ditches and culverts along the trail. Work is to be accomplished through a combination of equipment rental contracts and Bureau of Trails' own forces support which will be funded by this grant.

The following appropriation authorities are being requested:

Class 20 – Current Expenses – Appropriations will be used for the purchase of aggregate materials, culverts and other construction materials.

Class 22 - Rent - Leases other than State - Appropriation will be used for the renting of construction equipment

Class 29 – Intra Agency Transfers – Appropriation will be used for funding own force labor within the Trails Bureau

Class 41 – Audit Fund Set Aside – Additional appropriations needed to pay required audit fees

In the event that Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this project.

- 1.4.1. This agreement provides for funding of a progression of project activities. Initially design is eligible for reimbursement. Construction will not be eligible for reimbursement until an environmental decision document and the Final PS&E package are approved by Federal Highway Administration-Eastern Federal Lands Highway Division (FHWA).
- 1.4.2. FHWA and the NHTB (Recipient) may amend or terminate this agreement to adjust to project development, environmental, or construction needs.

1.5. PRELIMINARY DESIGN

1.5.1. Design

1.5.1.a Perform a site survey as necessary to support the design and environmental compliance needs of the project.

1.5.1.b Prepare and submit a preliminary plan package to FHWA. The preliminary plan package shall reflect the work as described in Section E of the attached MOA. Any deviations from the described work must be approved in writing by FHWA.

- Include a preliminary cost estimate with the preliminary plan package.
- **1.6. ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE** Note: Federally funded projects must fully comply with all requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). An appropriate range of reasonable alternatives will be evaluated for this project based on its scope and extent. Amendments to the scope of this may be required upon completion of the environmental clearance document and decision.

- 1.6.2. USFWS will coordinate environmental compliance efforts with FHWA environmental staff. See Sections G and H of the attached Project MOA. USFWS will prepare and submit a draft environmental document for FHWA signature utilizing samples and templates provided by FHWA. With the draft document supply a copy of the administrative record supporting the recommended action and if available provide a copy of any signed prior NEPA environmental decisions. Coordinate any changes associated with the prior NEPA environmental decision document with FHWA.
- 1.6.3. To support the preparation of the environmental document, the following environmental compliance tasks are anticipated to be needed and completed by the USFWS according to Sections G and H of the attached Project MOA.
 - 1.6.3.a National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA)
 - 1.6.3.a.1. The USFWS is to take the federal lead for Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) compliance including tribal consultation. Submit a letter to FHWA indicating that lead status.
 - 1.6.3.a.2. USFWS will initiate SHPO and tribal consultation early by proposing a project area of potential effect (APE) and considering their comments.
 - 1.6.3.a.3. A qualified archeologist shall perform background research and resource surveys of the area of potential effect (APE) for the project area in compliance with Department of Interior guidelines. If the APE includes land owned or controlled by the federal government, then obtain a permit from the federal land management agency to conduct resource surveys in accordance with the Archaeological Resources Protection Act.
 - 1.6.3.a.4. USFWS will include a written report documenting Section 106 findings and recommendations as part of the administrative record.
 - 1.6.3.a.5. USFWS will complete consultation with the SHPO, tribe(s), and public under Section 106 of the NHPA and submit documentation to FHWA showing it has been completed.

1.6.4. Wetlands

1.6.4.a A qualified biologist will identify the presence or absence of wetlands or other waters of the U.S. within the project area. Wetlands believed to be under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) should be identified. This may include but is not limited to referencing the National Wetland

Inventory or local wetland inventory, NRCS soil survey maps, and field observations.

1.6.4.a.1. If no potential wetlands are observed within the project area, these findings can be documented in a short report as part of the administrative record.

- 1.6.4.a.2. If potential wetlands exist in the project area, delineate and document wetlands in accordance with the USACE 1987 Wetland Delineation Manual as part of the administrative record.
- 1.6.5. Threatened & Endangered (T&E) Species and Essential Fish Habitat (EFH)
 1.6.5.a A qualified biologist or botanist shall perform threatened and endangered species and essential fish habitat studies within the project area.
 - 1.6.5.a.1. The biologist will obtain updated T&E species lists for the project area from the US Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) and, if appropriate, NOAA Fisheries Service.
 - 1.6.5.a.2. If there are no T&E species or EFH within the project area or the proposed project would have no effect to any T&E species or no adverse effect on EFH within the project area, the biologists/botanist shall include a finding in the administrative record documenting their finding and the basis for their conclusion.
 - 1.6.5.a.3. If there are T&E species within the project area and the project may affect these species, include a written Biological Assessment (BA) following USFWS guidelines in the administrative record.
 - 1.6.5.a.4. If the project may affect threatened or endangered species, perform Section 7 consultation as appropriate with USFWS and NOAA Fisheries Service. If appropriate, include consultation for EFH.

1.6.5.a.5. Following consultation, submit to FHWA a copy of Section 7 concurrence letter or Biological Opinion from the USFWS and/or NOAA Fisheries Service.

- 3.2.7.a The parties to this Agreement will communicate with one another in good faith and in a timely and cooperative manner when raising issues under this provision. Any dispute, which for the purposes of this provision includes any disagreement or claim, between the FHWA and the Recipient concerning questions of fact or law arising from or in connection with this Agreement and whether or not involving alleged breach of this Agreement, may be raised only under this Disputes provision.
- 3.2.7.b Whenever a dispute arises, the parties will attempt to resolve the issues involved by discussion and mutual agreement as soon as practical. In no event will a dispute which arose more than three months prior to the notification made under the following paragraph of this provision constitute the basis for relief under this article unless FHWA waives this requirement.
- 3.2.7.c Failing resolution by mutual agreement, the aggrieved party will document the dispute by notifying the other party in writing of the relevant facts, identify unresolved issues and specify the clarification or remedy sought. Within five working days after providing written notice to the other party, the aggrieved party may, in writing, request a decision from the AO. The AO will conduct a review of the matters in dispute and render a decision in writing within thirty calendar days of receipt of such written request. Any decision of the AO is final and binding unless a party will, within thirty calendar days, request further review as provided below.
- 3.2.7.d Upon written request to one level above the AO or designee, made within thirty calendar days after the AO's written decision or upon unavailability of a decision within the stated time frame under the preceding paragraph, the dispute will be further reviewed. This review will be conducted by one level above the AO. Following the review, all parties will be notified in writing. Such resolution is not subject to further administrative review and to the extent permitted by law, will be final and binding. Nothing in this Agreement is intended to prevent the parties from pursuing disputes in a United States Federal Court of competent jurisdiction.

A: <u>PURPOSE OF THIS AGREEMENT</u>

This Agreement documents the intent of the parties and sets forth the anticipated responsibilities of each party in the development, construction, and future maintenance of the subject project. The purpose of the Agreement is to identify and assign responsibilities for the environmental analysis, design, right-of-way, utilities, acquisition, operation, and construction as appropriate for this programmed project, and to ensure maintenance of the facility for public use if improvements are made. The parties understand that any final decision as to design or construction will not be made until after the environmental analysis required under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) is completed (this does not prevent the parties from assigning proposed design criteria to be studied in the NEPA process.) Any decision to proceed with the design, operations, or construction of the project will depend on the availability of appropriations at the time of obligation and other factors such as issues raised during the NEPA process, a natural disaster that changes the need for the project, a change in Congressional direction, or other relevant factors.

If Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP) funds are used for the development or construction of this project, the USFWS and State of New Hampshire Trails Bureau (NHTB) agrees to provide a matching share equal to 17.55% of the total cost of the project, as detailed more fully in Section J below. FLAP project funds are not to exceed the approved amount of \$88,240.00. Before the expenditure of any funds for which reimbursement will be sought from FHWA, the parties agree to execute a separate obligating document. No reimbursement will be made for expenditures made prior to having an obligating document in place.

B. <u>AUTHORITY</u>

This Agreement is entered into between the signatory parties pursuant to the provisions of 23 U.S.C. 204, and Sections 235:4, 215-C:2 and 216-F of the Revised Statutes Annotated of the State of New Hampshire.

C. JURISDICTION AND MAINTENANCE COMMITMENT

The New Hampshire Bureau of Trails (NHTB) has jurisdictional authority to operate and maintain the existing facility and will operate and maintain the completed project at its expense.

D. FEDERAL LAND MANAGEMENT AGENCY COORDINATION

The New Hampshire Bureau of Trails has coordinated project development with the Silvio O. Conte National Fish and Wildlife Refuge. The Silvio O. Conte National Fish and Wildlife Refuge support of the project is documented per the signed support letter dated 10/12/2016. Each party to this agreement who has a primary role in NEPA, design, or construction shall coordinate their activities with the Silvio O. Conte National Fish and Wildlife Refuge.

E. <u>PROJECT BACKGROUND/SCOPE</u>

This project will rehabilitate the Presidential Range Recreational Trail with a new surface and improve drainage issues. The Presidential Range Recreational trail is a 20-mile-long trail through the Presidential Range of New Hampshire's White Mountains. This project is focused on a 4-mile area of the trail through the Pondicherry Division of the Silvio O. Conte National Fish and Wildlife Refuge. The improvements will include:

- Trail grading and preparation.
- Restore side drainage ditches along four miles of trail.
- Replace 6 damaged steel culverts with 6 new 30' long 18" diameter culverts.
- Install 4" ledge pack aggregate surface 8 feet wide on 4 miles of rail grade.
- Grading and compacting of new trail surface.
- Purchase and installation of 4 Beaver water-flow leveling devices.
- Improvement of trailhead parking facility along Airport Road (expansion, new signage and additional gravel).
