REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to RSA 14:30-a, VI, authorize the New Hampshire Department of Transportation to accept and expend revenue in the amount of \$312,754 from the New Hampshire Department of Administrative Services for the disposition of state-owned commuter coaches, Concord Coach insurance proceeds for insured damages at the Concord Stickney Avenue bus terminal, and a Caterpillar engine class action settlement for eligible commuter coach engine repairs upon the date of Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2019. 100% Other Funds.

In SFY 2018, funds shall be accepted and expended within 04-096-096-964010-2050 – State Bus Service and Facilities, as follows:

EXPLANATION

The Department requests authorization to accept and expend the proceeds from the sale of federally-funded state-owned commuter coaches and equipment, in the amount of \$157,754; insurance proceeds realized from damage at the state-owned Concord Stickney Avenue bus terminal, in the amount of approximately \$20,000; and an anticipated claim from the settlement of a class action lawsuit relative to Caterpillar engines, in the amount of \$135,000. The use of these funds will offset expenses of planned federally-eligible capital equipment purchases such as state-owned vehicles and bus terminal improvements. Per Federal circular Federal Transit Administration (FTA) C 5010.1E FTA and 2 CFR part 200, subpart D, proceeds from the sale of real property or equipment greater than \$5,000 are restricted for use on Federal eligible Transit projects.

In State Fiscal Year 2018 the Department, via the Department of Administrative Services' Bureau of Purchase and Property (White Farm Surplus), sold 12 state-owned commuter coaches and one service vehicle yielding net revenue in the amount of \$157,754. Additionally, the state-owned Concord Stickney Avenue bus terminal had a pipe burst causing water damage to security camera and computer equipment and as such, the contracted facility operator, Concord Coach, and their insurer will provide reimbursement to the State to procure replacement equipment. The estimated replacement cost for the affected security camera and IT components is estimated to be \$20,000. Lastly, the Department submitted a claim for \$135,000 of a settlement of a class action lawsuit known as *In re: Caterpillar, Inc. C13 and C15 Engine Products Liability Litigation*, United States District Court District of New Jersey, MDL No. 2540, Master Docket No. 14-3722(JBS)(JS) relative to state-owned commuter coaches, operated by Boston Express, that experienced subject engine issues as defined in the settlement.

The Department therefore requests authority to accept and expend the above unanticipated revenue in the combined amount of \$312,754, in order to expend funds on planned eligible projects in accordance with Federal Transit Administration (FTA) guidance.

Your approval of this resolution is respectfully requested.
