INFORMATIONAL ITEM

Pursuant to RSA 4:45, RSA 21-P:43, and Executive Order 2020-04 as extended by Executive Orders 2020-05, 2020-08, 2020-09, 2020-10, 2020-14, 2020-15, 2020-16, 2020-17, 2020-18 and 2020-20, and suspension of Manual of Procedures 150, V, B, I requirement, Governor Sununu has authorized New Hampshire Employment Security (NHES) to enter into a retroactive, sole source contract amendment with the Center for Employment Security Education and Research (CESER) of Washington, DC, increasing the contract amount by \$124,356.69 from \$697,723.04 to \$822,079.73 for up to six months of additional Workforce Connect monthly subscription support and Single Sign On (SSO) knowledge acquisition. This contract amendment is paid with 100% Federal funds.

The original contract was approved by the Governor and Council on November 14, 2018 (Item #42). There have since been three amendments to the contract, Amendments A, B and C, approved by Governor and Council on November 25, 2019 (Item #48), February 5, 2020 (Item #25), and May 5, 2020 (Item #39), respectively.

Federal funding is available in State FY 2021 forward contingent upon availability and continued appropriations as follows, with the ability to adjust encumbrances between State Fiscal Years through the Budget Office, if needed and justified:

EXPLANATION

This retroactive, sole source contract amendment will provide NHES with up to six months of additional Workforce Connect monthly subscription support and Single Sign On (SSO) knowledge acquisition. The increased activity in the unemployment system brought on by the global COVID-19 pandemic delayed the ability for NHES to transition support and maintenance of the SSO application that controls the front door for entry into the unemployment system from the existing vendor to NHES. This amendment will allow for this delayed transition while ensuring sufficient knowledge acquisition by NHES and the NHES vendor supporting the New Hampshire unemployment system, SymbioSys solutions, Inc., to ensure for a seamless transition with no disruption to the claim filing public. Upon completion of this transition,

NHES and SymbioSys will then convert the SSO into a more stable part of the suite of applications in the New Hampshire unemployment system and will design it so that it is appropriately designed to handle volumes like that which we experienced during the pandemic.

In the event Federal funds become no longer available, General funds will not be requested to support this contract.

This letter represents formal notification that the Department of Information Technology (DoIT) has approved your agency's request to enter into a contract amendment with the Center for Employment Security Education and Research, Inc. (CESER), Information Technology Support Center (ITSC) Washington, DC, as described below and referenced as DoIT No. 2019-014D.

This amendment will provide additional monthly subscription support and Workforce Connect Single Sign on (SSO) Knowledge Acquisition for a three month period ending January 28, 2021 with an option for an additional month-to-month subscription support, not to exceed an additional six months from October 28, 2020. NHES will be transitioning support responsibilities to its current system support vendor.

The contract price will increase by \$124,356.69 from \$697,723.04 to \$822,079.73 and the contract end date will be extended from October 28, 2020 to April 28, 2021, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval.

A copy of this letter should accompany the New Hampshire Employment Security's submission to the Governor and Executive Council for approval.

NEW HAMPSHIRE EMPLOYMENT SECURITY WORKFORCE CONNECT SOFTWARE SUITE CONTRACT 2019-014 CONTRACT AMENDMENT D

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Agreement approved by Governor and Council on November 14, 2018, Item #42, hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement," the Center for Employment Security Education and Research, Inc. ("CESER"), hereinafter referred to as "Vendor," agreed to supply all phases of implementation of the Workforce Connect ("WFC") software suite, based upon terms and conditions specified in the Agreement, and in consideration of payment of certain sums by New Hampshire Employment Security ("NHES"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Agreement P-37 Section 18, the Agreement may be amended, waived or discharged only by an instrument in writing signed by the parties hereto and only after approval of such amendment, waiver or discharge by the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire unless no such approval is required under the circumstances pursuant to State law, rule or policy; and

WHEREAS, said Agreement was modified by a no-cost amendment (Contract Amendment A) dated November 4, 2019, and approved by Governor and Council on November 25, 2019, Item #48, to extend the completion date from September 30, 2019 to December 31, 2019; and

WHEREAS, NHES received approval on December 30, 2019 from the United States Department of Labor to further extend the period of performance of the grant funds authorized specifically to satisfy a forthcoming requirement for the integration of workforce programs to include the interoperability of data systems, referred to as a "common front door"; and

WHEREAS, said Agreement was modified by a no-cost amendment (Contract Amendment B) dated January 16, 2020, and approved by Governor and Council on February 5, 2020, Item #25, to extend the completion date from December 31, 2019 to April 30, 2020 to specifically extend the warranty support provided by the Vendor for all WFC Framework modifications and custom developed software code; and

WHEREAS, a contract modification (Contract Amendment C) was executed on May 5, 2020, and approved by Governor and Council on May 5, 2020, Item # 39 to extend the WFC system's warranty through October 28, 2020; and

WHEREAS, due to unforeseen complications caused by the global COVID-19 pandemic with regard to historically unprecedented spikes in individuals utilizing the unemployment compensation system thus delaying the ability of NHES to initiate knowledge acquisition of the WFC Single Sign On (SSO) system, NHES is now requesting additional monthly Warranty Support and WFC SSO Knowledge Acquisition to assist NHES and its NHUIS vendor, SymbioSys Solutions, Inc. ("SymbioSys"), to transition maintenance and support of the WFC SSO system to NHES and SymbioSys. Such additional Warranty Support and Knowledge Acquisition shall extend for a three (3) month period beginning on October 28, 2020 and ending January 28, 2021,

after which NHES may exercise options for additional month to month Warranty Support, not to exceed three (3) months from January 28, 2021.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the covenants and conditions contained in the Agreement and set forth herein, the parties agree as follows:

The General Provisions of the Agreement, including but not limited to, the P-37 Form and Exhibits A - C, are hereby amended as follows:

- 1. Amend Section 1.7 of the Agreement P-37 Form, as amended by Contract Exhibit C, by extending the Completion Date from October 28, 2020 to April 28, 2021.
- 2. Amend Section 1.8 of the Agreement P-37 Form, as amended by Contract Exhibit C, by increasing the Price Limitation by \$124,356.69 from \$697,723.04 to \$822,079.73.
- 3. Amend Exhibit A to the Agreement by adding after paragraph 8, the following provisions:

CHANGE DESCRIPTION (Effective October 28, 2020)

Vendor will provide NHES with monthly Warranty Support and WFC SSO Knowledge Acquisition for three (3) months following the expiration of its Warranty Support period for the WFC system (currently expiring on October 28, 2020), after which NHES may exercise options for additional month to month Warranty Support activities, not to exceed three (3) months from January 28, 2021.

Project Scope:

Warranty Support shall include defect fixes in the WFC application launched on January 28, 2020. In addition to Warranty Support, ITSC will provide WFC SSO Knowledge Acquisition for the three (3) month period beginning on October 28, 2020. This requested Warranty Support and the WFC SSO Knowledge Acquisition will begin after the expiration of the current six (6) month Warranty Support period on October 28, 2020. NHES has the option of additional month-to-month Warranty Support of the WFC system at the expiration of the three (3) month period established by this Contract Amendment D, not to exceed three (3) months from January 28, 2021.

Warranty Support:

Warranty Support as described at Agreement, Scope of Services, Section 1.3: Deliverables, Task 6 (added by Amendment B) and Task 7 (added by Amendment C) shall continue for a period of three months beginning on October 28, 2020 and ending January 28, 2021, after which NHES may exercise options for additional month-to-month Warranty Support not to exceed three (3) months from January 28, 2021. Rates and pricing for such Warranty Support shall be as provided in this Amendment D to the Agreement

The following Warranty support will be provided for agreed to defects/bugs should any arise during the Warranty Support period:

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- Warranty Support covers issues arising with the original implementation of the NHES
 system as launched January 28, 2020. (i.e., the original infrastructure and environments
 associated with the phase 1 implementation of Workforce Connect for NHES. Support for
 any additional environments or components for external systems by other vendors are
 excluded from this support model.)
- Warranty Support also includes verification and troubleshooting support for issues that may arise with the WFC open source products. This does not include any customization or modifications associated with the Open Source application source code.
- 3. Warranty Support will be provided during the business hours for NHES (Monday thru Friday 8 a.m. 6 p.m.). If off-hour responses are required there may be additional project change orders ("PCOs") and fees. Monitoring of the system will continue to be performed by State and ITSC support will be initiated by state personnel once an issue has been identified.

Single Sign On (SSO) Knowledge Acquisition:

Vendor will work with NHES and its designated NHUIS vendor, SymbioSys Solutions, Inc., in Knowledge Acquisition regarding the WFC SSO component. The Knowledge Acquisition will not exceed 450 hours and will be billed at the actual hours expended for each month. The following items will be covered with NHES as part of the Knowledge Acquisition:

1. Architecture and Setup:

- Hardware/VMware on which relevant components are hosted;
- Relevant software w/version #s installed on each;
- The following components:
 - o SSO application
 - o Open AM
 - o Open DJ
 - o SQL server
- Server-level configurations such as firewalls and ports;

- Any special configurations/setup items with the network team to allow access to the application;
- Certificates used:
- Load balancing considerations;
- Failover considerations;
- Anticipated and projected loads.

2. Implementation: Software Configurations and Custom Code:

- Software components:
 - o App Server;
 - o Web Server,

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- ForgeRock Access Manager/Open AM;
- o LDAP/OpenDJ.
- o Web agents/Policy agents;
- o Custom-built services:
- Configuration details of each software component;
- Extent and areas of customization vs. configuration for software component;

- WISH Server/services relevant to SSO;

Anticipated support and timeline:

First month of support:

First month maintenance and support will primarily be handled by Vendor. All defects will be reported to NHES and NHES's NHUIS vendor SymbioSys. SymbioSys will report defects to ITSC and ITSC will involve SymbioSys in the resolution.

Second month of support:

In month two, SymbioSys will primarily support SSO, relying on Vendor for any assistance needed.

Third month of support:

In the third month, SymbioSys will take over Single Sign On (SSO) but may have questions, concerns, etc. for Vendor. At the end of the third month knowledge transfer from Vendor to NHES and SymbioSys should be successfully completed.

Additional month-to-month support:

NHES has the option of additional month-to-month Warranty Support of the WFC system at the expiration of the three (3) month Warranty Support period, not to exceed three (3) months from January 28, 2021.

4. Amend Exhibit B to the Agreement by adding after Paragraph 9.1, the following provision:



NHES is requesting approval of the attached agreement for all phases of implementation of the Workforce Connect software suite. NHES received a grant award from the United States Department of Labor – Employment and Training Administration (USDOL/ETA) for the purpose of satisfying a forthcoming requirement for the integration of workforce programs to include the interoperability of data systems, referred to as a "common front door".

Workforce Connect is a software suite designed by CESER's Unemployment Insurance Information Technology Support Center (ITSC) and three pilot states (New York, Mississippi and Oregon) through a grant from the USDOL/ETA, and is a customizable software suite available to all states. 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1 SCOPE OF SERVICES

1.1 OVERVIEW

New Hampshire Employment Security ("NHES") provides unemployment compensation and reemployment services to the public at twelve (12) facilities located throughout New Hampshire. Under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act ("WIOA"), the United States Department of Labor Employment and Training Administration ("USDOUETA") is requiring the integration of workforce programs to include the interoperability of data systems, referred to as a "common front door".

NHES was authorized federal funds from USDOL/ETA for the purpose of implementing a new on-line, front-end interface system to establish common registration and case management services ecross the Employment Service and Unemployment Insurance programs. Partner Agencies will have the ability to post static information to the Dashboard.

The scope of services to be provided by the Center for Employment Security Education and Research, Inc. Workforce Connect helps states implement WIOA by connecting partners and providing a scamless experience for job seckers by octing as the "common front door" for workforce agencies' programs and systems – including unemployment insurance, employment services and workforce/training.

CESER is a nonprofit organization created by the National Association of State Workforce Agencies ("NASWA") - the association of \$3 state and territorial workforce agencies - to benefit the common/shared interests of these agencies and the programs they edminister. As such, CESER is uniquely positioned to provide broad-based state expertise to the development of technical assistance and training products for use by these agencies. CESER exists as an educational and research center devoted to improving government services to America's workers and employers. CESER provides a full array of consultative, research and education services to federal, state and local public and private entities. Products developed by CESER have become the foundation for workforce development system-building and have been distributed throughout the country to states and local workforce areas.

USDOL/ETA established ITSC through a competitive grant process awarded to the State of Maryland in 1994 to promote the development of Unemployment Insurance (UI) Information Technology (IT) enhancements for, and information-sharing among, state unemployment insurance agencies. The ITSC is dedicated to developing and advancing IT solutions that provide more accurate, cost-effective, and timely service for unemployment insurance customers and staff. ITSC is a unique collaboration of NASWA, CESER, state workforce agencies, USDOL and the State of Maryland.

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1.2 STATEMENT OF WORK

To integrate systems that are already in production requires a lot of knowledge and expertise of both the CESER and NHES systems experts. This Agreement will require the overall team to work hand and hand on all technical aspects associated with integration. This process will allow for the team to understand the overall volumes anticipated for the application. These volumes will provide NHES with the ability to properly size and procure att hardware required throughout the project.

The supporting interfaces will allow for the flow of data between the existing systems, authentication verification and presentation of Workforce information on the Workforce Dashboard. Modifications to existing NHES systems shall be performed by NHES and/or its contractors.

The CESER team will follow an agile development process which will allow for testing during each phase of the project. Based on the development efforts of each phase there will be multiple phases of testing that occurs. All newly developed code and configuration modification will have the following testing phases.

2.5 REFERENCE AND BACKGROUND CHECKS

The Contractor shall conduct criminal background checks and not utilize any staff, including authorizators, to fulfill the obligations of the contract who have been convicted of any crime of dishonesty, including but not limited to criminal fraud, or otherwise convicted of any felony or misdemeanor offense for which incarceration for up to 1 year is an authorized penalty. The Contractor shall promote and maintain an awareness of the importance of securing the State's information among the Contractor's employees and agents.

3.1 SOFTWARE TITLE

The Contractor shall license back to the State the right to produce, publish, or otherwise use such software, source code, object code, modifications, reports, and Documentation developed under the Contract.

In no event shall the Contractor be precluded from developing for itself, or for others, materials that are competitive with, or similar to Custom Software, modifications developed in connection with performance of obligations under the Contract. In addition, the Contractor shall be free to use its general knowledge, skills, experience, and any other ideas, concepts, know-how, and techniques that are acquired or used in the course of its performance under this agreement.

3.2 STATE'S DATA AND PROPERTY

All rights, title and interest in State Data shall remain with the State. All data and any property which has been received from the State or purchased with funds provided for that purpose under this Agreement, shall be the property of the State, and shall be returned to the State upon demand or upon termination of this Agreement for any reason. The Contractor shall not access State user accounts or State data, except (1) in the course of data center operations, (2) in response to service or technical issues, (3) as required by the express terms of this contract or (4) at the State's written request.

3.3 CONTRACTOR'S MATERIALS

Subject to the provisions of this Contract, the Contractor may develop for itself, or for others, materials that are competitive with, or similar to, the Deliverables. In accordance with the provision of this Contract, the Contractor shall not distribute any products containing or disclose any State Confidential Information. The Contractor shall be free to use its general knowledge, skills and experience, and any ideas, concepts, know-how, and techniques that are sequired or used in the course of its performance under this Contract, provided that such is not obtained as the result of the deliberate memorization of the State Confidential Information by the Contractor employees or third party consultants engaged by the Contractor.

Without limiting the foregoing, the parties agree that the general knowledge referred to herein cannot include information or records not subject to public disclosure under New Hampshire RSA Chapter 91-A.

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which includes but is not limited to the following: records of grand juries and petit juries; records of purole and pardon boards; personal school records of pupils; records pertaining to internal personnel practices, financial information, test questions, scoring keys and other examination data use to administer a licensing examination, examination for employment, or academic examination and personnel, medical, welfare, library use, video tape sale or rental, and other files containing personally identifiable information that is private in nature.

3.4 STATE WEBSITE COPYRIGHT

WWW Copyright and Intellectual Property Rights

All right, title and interest in the State WWW site <NH.GOV, etc.>, including copyright to all Data and information, shall remain with the State. The State shall also retain all right, title and interest in any user interfaces and computer instructions embedded within the WWW pages. All WWW pages and any other Data or information shall, where applicable, display the State's copyright.

3.5 CUSTOM SOFTWARE SOURCE CODE

In the event that the State purchases software development services, which results in Custom Software, the Contractor shall provide the State with a copy of the source code for the Custom Software, which shall be subject to the License rights. The State shall receive a worldwide, perpetual, irrevocable, non-exclusive paid—up right and license to use, copy, modify and prepare derivative works of any custom developed software. This section does not apply to the Contractor's proprietary software code.

3.6 SURVIVAL

This Contract Agreement Section 10: Intellectual Property shall survive the termination of the Contract.

4 USE OF STATE'S INFORMATION, CONFIDENTIALITY

4.1 USE OF STATE'S INFORMATION

In performing its obligations under the Contract, the Contractor may gain access to information of the State, including State Confidential Information. "State Confidential Information" shall include, but not be limited to, information exempted from public disclosure under New Hampshire RSA Chapter 91-A: Access to Public Records and Meetings (see e.g. RSA Chapter 91-A: 5 Exemptions). The Contractor shall not use the State Confidential Information developed or obtained during the performance of, or acquired, or developed by reason of the Contract, except as directly connected to and necessary for the Contractor's performance under the Contract.

4.2 STATE CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

The Contractor shall maintain the confidentiality of and protect from unauthorized use, disclosure, publication, and reproduction (collectively "release"), all State Confidential Information that becomes available to the Contractor in connection with its performance under the Contract, regardless of its form.

Subject to applicable federal or State laws and regulations, Confidential Information shall not include information which: (i) shall have otherwise become publicly available other than as a result of disclosure by the receiving party in breach hereof; (ii) was disclosed to the receiving party on a non-confidential basis from a source other than the disclosing party, which the receiving party believes is not prohibited

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from disclosing such information as a result of an obligation in favor of the disclosing party; (iii) is developed by the receiving party independently of, or was known by the receiving party prior to, any disclosure of such information made by the disclosing party; or (iv) is disclosed with the written consent of the disclosing party. A receiving party also may disclose Confidential Information to the extent required by an order of a court of competent jurisdiction.

Any disclosure of the State Confidential Information shall require the prior written approval of the State. The Contractor shall immediately notify the State if any request, subpoens or other legal process is served upon the Contractor regarding the State Confidential Information, and the Contractor shall cooperate with the State in any effort the State undertakes to contest the request, subpoens or other legal process, at on additional cost to the State.

In the event of the unsultonized release of State Confidential Information, the Contractor shall immediately notify the State, and the State may immediately be excited to pursue any remedy at law and in equity, including, but not limited to, injunctive relief.

4.3 CONTRACTOR CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION.

Insofer as the Contractor seeks to maintain the confidentiality of its confidential or proprietary information, the Contractor must clearly identify in writing all information it claims to be confidential or proprietary. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the State acknowledges that the Contractor considers the Software and Documentation to be Confidential Information. The Contractor acknowledges that the State is subject to State and federal laws governing disclosure of information including, but not limited to, RSA Chapter 91-A. The State shall maintain the confidentiality of the identified Confidential Information insofar as it is consistent with applicable State and federal laws or regulations, including but not limited to, RSA Chapter 91-A. In the event the State receives a request for the information identified by the Contractor as confidential, the State shall notify the Contractor and specify the date the State will be releasing the requested information. At the request of the State, the Contractor shall cooperate and assist the State with the collection and review of the Contractor's information, at no additional expense to the j State. Any effort to prohibit or enjoin the release of the information shall be the Contractor's sole responsibility and at the Contractor's sole expense. If the Contractor fails to obtain a court order enjoining the disclosure, the State shall release the information on the date specified in the State's notice to the Contractor, without any liability to the Contractor.

4.4 SURVIVAL

This Contract Agreement Section 11, Use of State's Information, Confidentiality, shall survive termination or conclusion of the Contract.

5 LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

5.1 . STATE

Subject to applicable laws and regulations, in no event shall the State be liable for any consequential, special, indirect, incidental, punitive, or exemplary damages. Subject to applicable laws and regulations, the State's liability to the Contractor shall not exceed the total Contract price set forth in Contract Agreement – General Provisions, Block 1.8.

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5.2 CONTRACTOR

Subject to applicable laws and regulations, in no event shall the Contractor be liable for any consequential, special, indirect, incidental, punitive or exemplary damages and the Contractor's liability to the State shall not exceed two times (2X) the total Contract price set forth in Contract Agreement – P
37. General Provisions, Block 1.8.

Norwithstanding the foregoing, this limitation of liability shall not apply to the Contractor's indemnification obligations set forth in the Contract Agreement-General Provisions Section 13: Indemnification and confidentiality obligations in Contract Agreement-General Provisions Section 11: Use of State's Information, Confidentiality, which shall be unlimited.

STATE'S IMMUNITY

Norwithstanding the foregoing nothing herein contained shall be deemed to constitute a waiver of the sovereign immunity of the State, which immunity is hereby reserved to the State. This coverant shall survive termination or Contract conclusion.

5.4 SURVIVAL

This Section 12: Limitation of Liability shall survive termination or Contract conclusion.

6 DISPUTE RESOLUTION

Prior to the filing of any formal proceedings with respect to a dispute (other than an action seeking injunctive relief with respect to intellectual property rights or Confidential Information), the party believing itself aggrieved (the "Invoking Party") shall call for progressive management involvement in the dispute negotiation by written notice to the other party. Such notice shall be without prejudice to the Invoking Party's right to any other remedy permitted under the Contract.

The parties shall use reasonable efforts to arrange personal meetings and/or telephone conferences as needed, at mutually convenient times and places, between negotiators for the parties at the following successive management levels, each of which shall have a period of allotted time as specified below in which to attempt to resolve the dispute:

Either party may terminate this agreement for convenience at any time prior to effective date of termination by giving sixty (60) days advance written notice of intent to terminate to the other party.

10.4 CONFIDENTIALITY AND CRIMINAL RECORD

Contractor and each of its employees working on NHES property will be required to sign and submit a STATEMENT OF CONFIDENTIALITY OF RECORDS FORM prior to the start of any work under this Agreement. The Contractor has represented that its administrative staff and interpreter staff undergo NH criminal background checks as part of the hiring process. If there is any individual working for the Contractor who will be visiting an NHES facility who has not completed such screening process, the Contractor agrees that a Criminal Record Authorization Form will be provided prior to the start of any on site work by such employee. There is a fee for each background check required, which must be paid by the Contractor.

10.5 INSURANCE

Contractor will furnish a Certificate of Insurance as evidence of the existence of Comprehensive General Liability insurance against all claims of bodily injury, death or property damage, in amounts of not less than \$1,000,000 per claim and \$2,000,000 per incident. Contractor agrees to maintain workers' compensation and employer's liability insurance for all Contractor employees engaged in the performance of the agreement and provided updated certificates for such coverage.

10.6 CERTIFICATION REGARDING DEBARMENT, SUSPENSION AND OTHER RESPONSIBILITY MATTERS IN PRIMARY COVERED TRANSACTIONS

Contractor certifies that the primary participant, and its principals, to the best of its knowledge and belief, are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarrent, declared incligible or voluntarily excluded from covered

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transactions by any Federal department or State agency. Contractor will inform NHES of any changes in the status regarding this statement.

10.7 VENDOR APPLICATION/ALTERNATE W-9

In connection with this Contract, the Contractor shall have completed and filed a Vendor Application and Alternate W-9 Form with the New Hampshire Buresu of Purchase and Property.

10.8 AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

The undersigned Contractor agrees to comply with all Federal, State and Local ADA rules and regulations.

10.9 NON-DISCRIMINATION

In connection with the furnishing of services under the Contract, the Contractor agrees to comply with all laws, regulations, and orders of federal, state, country or municipal authority which impose any obligations or duties upon the Contractor, including but not limited to civil rights laws, non-discrimination laws and equal opportunity laws.

During the term of the Contract, Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, creed, age, sex, sexual orientation, disability, national origin, marital status or veteran status, and will take appropriate steps to prevent such discrimination.

10.10 DAMAGE

Contractor agrees that any damage to building(s), materials, equipment or other property during performance of its services will be repaired at its expense. Contractor agrees to return all buildings, materials, equipment or property affected by the Contractor's work to their original condition or better. Contractor agrees to obtain approval of the NHES representative assigned to project for any sub-contractor performing such repair work.

10.11 SUB-CONTRACTING

Contractor will not assign, subcontract or otherwise transfer any dury, obligation, or performance required by this Agreement without the prior written consent of NHES.

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
