#### REQUESTED ACTION

The Department of Cultural Resources requests permission, to award Conservation Number Plate Grants in the amount of \$6,850.00 to the Litchfield Historical Society (Vendor Code 230238) effective upon Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2013. Other funds are available in 01-34-34-340010-6999-054 -500527.

#### **EXPLANATION**

Pursuant to RSA 261:97-c Conservation Number Plate Funds are used to promote the use and conservation of cultural resources in New Hampshire and to preserve the cultural heritage that belongs to all New Hampshire citizens by providing for the preservation of publicly-owned historic properties.

At a recent meeting, the Commissioner and Division Directors unanimously voted to accept the Arts Division's Cultural Conservation review panel's recommendations for the Conservation Number Plate Grants based on its funding priority ranking within a competitive review. The three-member peer panel, facilitated by an Arts Councilor, considered ten criteria to arrive at a consensus ranking for each application. Each panelist is advised, both individually and collectively, of their obligation to disclose any conflict of interest and themselves from assessment if a conflict is present. The evaluative criteria range from the historical significance of the conservation project and the degree of public benefit to the qualifications of the conservation professionals and the quality of the project plan.

The Litchfield Historical Society seeks support for the conservation and restoration of Naumkeag Grange #241 Grand Drape and an advertising curtain that hung at Litchfield's Naumkeag Grange Hall #241 from 1908 until its closure ins 1976. The Grand Drape which hung at the front of the second floor theater stage was painted in 1907 and displays a scene of Passaconaway, the famous Naticook Indian Chief in full regalia atop a horse with a river and forests in the background. The advertising curtain hung at the back of the stage and shows various advertisement from Litchfield and surrounding business areas. It was painted sometime in the 1930s to recognize various sponsors of different events that took place at the grange.

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Chief Passaconaway once owned land in what is now present day Litchfield and summered on an island in the Merrimack River just off the banks of Litchfield allocated to him by the Massachusetts General Court in Boston in 1662. The Grand Drape is one of only two known curtains in New Hampshire that displays in its painted scenery a distinct New Hampshire historical context. The advertising curtain highlights and early partnerships between the arts and local business and shows the economic life of the town almost a century ago.

It was believed both curtains burned in a fire that destroyed the Naumkeag Grange #241 in 1980. They were rediscovered in 2006; the Grand Drape in offsite storage at the historic town barn and the advertising curtain was found in a second family owned Litchfield barn.

After conservation the Litchfield Historical Society will display the curtains in a publicly accessible space; either the Society's exhibition hall or the former Griffin Memorial Elementary School which is the location for a proposed cultural center in Litchfield.




