REQUESTED ACTION

Pursuant to the provisions of RSA14:30-a,VI, Additional Revenues, authorize the Department of Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health Services, Bureau of Population Health and Community Services, Chronic Disease Prevention and Screening Section, Oral Health Program to accept and expend federal funds in the amount of \$315,295 from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration to fund the Grants to States to Support Oral Health Workforce Activities effective upon date of approval by the Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council, through June 30, 2017, and further authorize the funds to be allocated as follows. Grants funds awarded for periods after SFY 2017 will be included in the operating budgets for SFY 2018 and SFY 2019. 100% Federal Funds.

EXPLANATION

The Grant to States to Support Oral Health Workforce Activities is a federal-state-local partnership designed to develop and implement programs that address oral health workforce needs in geographic shortage areas and among underserved populations in Dental Health Professional Shortage Areas. Oral health workforce activities funded through this grant will improve access to oral health care for people residing in six rural Dental Health Professional Shortage Areas. Additionally, two new innovative workforce models, Certified Public Health Dental Hygienists and Expanded Function Dental Auxiliaries, will help fill the workforce gap providing oral health integration with primary medical practice and comprehensive preventive and disease management services in community-based settings. This work will be accomplished through a sole source contract with Bi-State Primary Care Association that worked on the development of the federal grant application and has the technical expertise to recruit dental professionals to rural New Hampshire.

Over the two-year project period, contract funding will be used to purchase dental equipment and supplies that will enable Expanded Function Dental Auxiliaries and their partner dentists to increase their capacity to meet the great demand for restorative care in fixed and portable sites and deploy Certified Public Health Dental Hygienists to stabilize and reduce the rate of dental disease and the need for restorative treatment in remote sites. It will also fund training/certification for four dental hygienists and four dental assistants to take on these new workforce roles, train dentists to maximize the new teams' ability to increase access, and pay for four additional certified dental assistants to work with the new Expanded Function Dental Assistants.

This grant will help improve access to oral health services at: the dental center and the five satellite medical practices of the Federally Qualified Health Center in Grafton county; new dental center in Coos County; a Sullivan county Health Center and Middle/High School; senior centers and long term care facilities in Coos County; the dental centers in the Federally Qualified Health Centers in Rockingham and Strafford counties.

In Strafford County, grant funds will pay a contractor to develop and facilitate an interprofessional educational program for health profession students in training at Goodwin Health Center to advance leadership in integrating oral health into patient-centered practice settings. A novel model for recruitment of water works operators is also funded. Outreach sessions with schools and community organizations will promote the impact of water operators on the health of the public and the benefit of fluoridated public drinking water.

Additional objectives of the grant teach the next generation of dentists how to maximize capacity of the dental workforce by providing clinical experiences for dental students in two Federally Qualified Health Centers that employ Certified Public Health Dental Hygienists and Expanded Function Dental Auxiliaries. Additionally, the grant will convene a training session for at least 50 dental

professionals from both public and private practice about the utilization the two new workforce members so there will be enhanced access to oral health services across the state.

Funds are to be budgeted as follows:

- Funds in class 041- Audit Fund Set Aside per state requirements.
- Funds in class 080 Out-of-State Travel to cover travel expenses to attend American Water Works Association in Denver, Colorado; trip to meet with the chairman of the New England Operator's Certification Committee in Hartford, Connecticut; trip to New England Water Works Association in Holliston, Massachusetts.
- Funds in class 102 Contracts for Program Services to establish a new contract with Bi-State Primary Care Association for implementation of the grant activities related to development of oral health workforce

In response to the anticipated two-part question, "Can these funds be used to offset General Funds?" and "What is the compelling reason for not offsetting General Funds?" the Division offers the following information: These funds may not be used to offset General Funds as they are specifically granted to the State for the purpose of providing the services described above.

These funds will not change the program eligibility levels. No new program will be established with the acceptance of these funds.

Area served: Coos County, northern Grafton County, Sullivan County, Strafford County, and the seacoast are of Rockingham County.

Source of funds: These funds are 100% Federal funds from the U.S. Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to fund the Grants to States to Support Oral Health Workforce Activities. Attached is the Notice of Grant Award and award history. Notice of these funds was received on July 27, 2016. They were not added to the operating budget because these are new funds recently granted to the State and were not anticipated at the time the budget was developed.

In the event that these Federal Funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program.
