#### REQUESTED ACTION

Approve East Coast Conference of the Evangelical Covenant Church d/b/a Pilgrim Pines' request to perform the following work on Swanzey Lake in Swanzey. File # 2019-01456. This project will not have significant impact on or adversely affect the values of Swanzey Lake.

Retain an existing 5 foot x 46 foot seasonal pier with a 5 foot x 10 foot attached section in an "L" configuration; replace a 6 foot x 73 foot seasonal pier leading to an 8 foot x 8 foot platform with a 5 foot x 78 foot seasonal pier maintaining the existing "T" configuration; and install a 6 foot x 70 foot seasonal pier on an average of 1377 linear feet of frontage, along Swanzey Lake in Swanzey.

The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) imposed the following conditions as part of this approval:

- 1. All work shall be in accordance with plans by Karen Manlove dated July 1, 2019 and as received by the New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services ("the Department") on July 1, 2019.
- 2. This permit is not valid and effective until it has been recorded with the appropriate county Registry of Deeds by the applicant. Prior to starting work under this permit, the permittee shall submit a copy of the recorded permit to the Department Wetlands Bureau by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- 3. These structures shall be permitted for so long as the frontages are used in their current status as a seasonal commercial youth camp. If the usage of the frontage changes to private residence, then the docking structures must come into compliance with the current rules and regulations at the time of change in use.
- All development activities associated with this project shall be conducted in compliance with applicable requirements of RSA 483-B and NH Code of Administrative Rules Env-Wq 1400 during and after construction.
- 5. Work shall be carried out in a time and manner to avoid disturbances to migratory waterfowl breeding and nesting areas.
- 6. Appropriate turbidity controls shall be installed prior to construction, shall be maintained during construction such that no turbidity escapes the immediate dredge area, and shall remain until suspended particles have settled and water at the work site has returned to normal clarity.
- 7. All construction-related debris shall be placed outside of the areas subject to RSA 482-A.
- 8. Any subdivision of the property frontage will require removal of a sufficient portion of the docking structures to comply with the dock size and density requirements in effect at the time of the subdivision.
- Only those structures shown on the approved plans shall be installed or constructed along this frontage. All portions of the structures shall be at least 20 feet from the abutting property lines or the imaginary extension of those lines into the water.
- 10. No person undertaking any activity shall cause or contribute to, or allow the activity to cause or contribute to, any violations of the surface water quality standards in RSA 485-A and Env-Wq 1700.

- 11. This permit shall not preclude the Department from initiating appropriate action if the Department later determines that any of the structures depicted as "existing" on the plans submitted by or on behalf of the permittee were not previously permitted or grandfathered.
- 12. All seasonal structures shall be removed for the non-boating season.

#### **EXPLANATION**

The NHDES approved this project on July 03, 2019. The NHDES supported its decision with the following findings:

- 1. This is a major impact project per Administrative Rule Env-Wt 303.02(d), construction or modification of major docking system defined by Env-Wt 101.57
- 2. The applicant has provided evidence which demonstrates that this proposal is the alternative with the least adverse impact to areas and environments under the Department's jurisdiction per Rule Env-Wt 302.03.
- 3. The applicant has demonstrated by plan and example that each factor listed in Rule Env-Wt 302.04(a) Requirements for Application Evaluation, has been considered in the design of the project.
- 4. The Department finds that because the project is not of significant public interest and will not significantly impair the resources of Swanzey Lake, a public hearing under RSA 482-A:8 is not required.
- 5. The applicant has an average of 1376 feet of shoreline frontage along Swanzey Lake.
- 6. The proposed docking facility will provide 12 slips as defined per RSA 482-A:2, VIII and therefore meets Rule Env-Wt 402.13.
- 7. The applicant has submitted information showing the proposed docking facility will not provide excessive boat slips as defined per RSA 482-A, Boat slip, on either lot and as is within the limitations of Rule Env-Wt 402.13.
- 8. The applicant has provided the Department with evidence that the property has insufficient water depth as required by Env-Wt 402.03(b)(2).
- 9. The Department has accepted the evidence of the physical hardship and approved the extension of a seasonal pier beyond that permissible under Env-Wt 402.03(a)(2).

Application file documents are being forwarded to the Governor and the Executive Council in connection with their consideration of this matter pursuant to RSA 482-A:3,II.(a) as it is a major project in public waters of the state.






