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The New Hampshire Procurement Technical Assistance Center (NH PTAC), a cooperative agreement program of the Division of Economic Development and Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), has received an increase in its annual grant from DLA.

NH PTAC provides technical assistance to New Hampshire companies (clients) navigating the complexities of government contracting. In federal FY18, federal contracts and subcontracts in New Hampshire were valued at over \$2.7 billion, with \$730+ million awarded to small businesses.

Effective March 1, 2019, the United States Department of Defense (DoD), desiring that nationwide PTACs be expanded, increased the matching contribution from a 50/50 basis to a 60/40 basis, contingent upon non-DoD contributions remaining level. The consequence was a 25% increase in the DoD funding available to NH PTAC, with no additional match required. This more favorable contribution ratio has continued, and was included in the current National Defense Authorization Act.

NH PTAC's cooperative agreement contains certain performance metrics and goals. With the increase in funding, DoD required a commensurate increase in some of those goals. In order to meet the increased goal for counseling hours, NH PTAC added a part-time counselor (Program Specialist IV, Labor Grade 25) to the staff in February 2020. The primary purpose of the additional federal funding is to maintain this position.

Although adding this position carries some ongoing support expenses, including software licenses, and telecommunications services, sufficient DoD funds are available to fully support these expenses.

The following appropriations are being requested for Fiscal Year 2021:

"Due to the recipient's recent history of marginal performance, this award is issued with the following special conditions that will persist throughout the period of performance:

- 1. The recipient must conduct and report a minimum of 1,345 hours of counseling during the period of performance. This represents approximately 500 hours of counseling for each Full-Time Counselor, 300 hours of counseling for the Part-Time Counselor and 45 hours for the Program Manager.
- 2. The recipient must use Block 11 of the DLA 1806 form to report the oversight actions taken to ensure counseling is reported accurately in the quarterly performance report.
- 3. The cost per counseling hour achieved must not exceed \$406.41. The cost per counseling hour is calculated as follows: total cost incurred divided by counseling hours achieved.
