PETITION FOR SHOW-CAUSE HEARING

This Petition and photocopies of the attached three (3) documents of Nov. 10 + 24 + 24 are hereby refiled with this original and five copies so as to bring this total petition into compliance with Rules 201.02(a) and 204.01(c) respectfully, and so as to AVOID the Rule 20401(a) return with the Rule 201.02(b) conditional denial.

Please see the WHEREFORE SUMMARY and #1,2+3 in my Claim of Nov. 24th for "the action which the petitioner wishes the commission to take" (Rule 205.01(a)(4)) and for the "concise statement of the facts" (Rule 205.01(a)(3); emphasis added) respectfully, plus WHEREAS #2 of the Claim of Nov. 10th and Admission #5 for Nov. 24th citing the constitution and case law so-called plus #2 in said claim of November 24th again for the statute and "other authority" being the dictionary (as indicated in footnotes #2 + #1-4 of the Claim and Notice of Nov. 24th respectfully) so as to comply with Rule 205.01(a)(5).

Thus as indicated in the WHEREFORE this is NOT a Petition for declaratory ruling by Rule 204.03(b) BUT a Rule 204.03(a) complaint, which document, in four parts, is being "deposited in the United States Mails, first class postage prepaid, addressed to" each of the 30 Presidential and 4 Vice Presidential candidates at their mailing addresses as listed on the four pages at your website www.state.nh.us/sos (see Rule 204.03(d)(1)) this afternoon, with postal receipt copy to provide later.

So the replies from each candidate are to the facts as indicated (compare #1 in CLAIM of Nov. 24th to #2 in the NOTICE of Nov. 24th) AND authority of: the constitution, case-law, statute and dictionary to either admit or deny by Rule 205.01(b)(3)+(4) with any additional or different facts "which warrant the commission acting in the manner requested by the respondent" and citing "any statutes, rules, orders or other authority, not identified in the petition having a bearing upon the subject matter of the petition" (Rule 205.01(c)) so as to lead toward the Rule 206.02(a) "adjudicative proceeding", with "notice to the parties at least 15 days before the hearing date."
