**REQUESTED ACTION**


That approval be and hereby is given to the Attorney General to grant a salary increment to Robert J. Sullivan, Criminal Investigator (Position #9U618, Appropriation #02-20-20-200510-2615-014-500134), from a salary level of \$68,910.40 (LG BB, Step 4) to a salary level of \$72,668.96 (LG BB, Step 5); effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval or June 21, 2019, whichever is the latter.

**EXPLANATION**

#### INVESTIGATOR, 2017-Present

In June of 2017, I was appointed by the Governor's Office to the position of Criminal Investigator at the Attorney General's Office. I was assigned to the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit on June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2017. The unit is responsible for criminal investigations involving board and care facilities, elder abuse, elder exploitation, and drug diversion.



### SAN BERNARDINO POLICE DEPARTMENT

During my tenure with the San Bernardino Police Department, I have worked as a patrol officer, a bicycle mounted enforcement team officer, a field training officer, a narcotics investigator, a robbery detective, an internal affairs detective, a homicide detective, a homicide sergeant, a patrol sergeant, and an investigations sergeant.

#### SERGEANT (SUPERVISOR), 2010-2017

In October of 2010, I was certified to the rank of Sergeant and assigned to lead the homicide unit. From October until mid-December, the homicide unit was challenged with numerous high-profile murders, death investigations, and an officer involved shooting. I excelled during this time. It was my honor to train the new members of our team and ensured that quality investigations were being completed. I worked hard at keeping management informed and the investigators focused on the job, immune to the city politics associated with the high profile cases.

In December of 2010, the department experienced a need for patrol supervisors and I was sent to patrol. I successfully completed the SBPD sergeant field training program and all the less lethal option training.

I was promoted to Sergeant in April of 2011 and was assigned to patrol. I was often called upon to train the newly promoted sergeants.

In 2014, I transferred to the Detective Bureau and was assigned to supervise the District Crimes investigative team. I supervised 7 detectives and 2 civilian investigators.

In 2015, I transferred to the Homicide Unit within the Detective Bureau and was assigned to supervise the Homicide investigative team. I headed the IRC Mass Shooting homicide investigation (terrorist attack) on 12-2-15. I supervised 10 detectives.

#### **DETECTIVE, 2004 - 2010**

In 2004, I was promoted to detective and was assigned work robbery investigations. I also worked as an internal affairs investigator and served five years in homicide.

In April of 2008, the department formed a Cold Case unit. I was one of the first two detectives assigned to review all of the unsolved homicides from 1977-2007.
